The City of Sharonville is once again excited for our annual Fourth of July parade and celebration on Wednesday, July 4, 2018 beginning at NOON. This year's theme is "Remember Why it's the 4th of July". Our parade will once again start at the corner of Reading and Sharon Road in Downtown Sharonville and will be following the entire Downtown Sharonville Loop! This is your chance to be a part of a Sharonville tradition. There are many ways to join in on the fun:

- Enter a float, classic car, marchers, mascots, musical groups, or performers into the parade. (Open to businesses, churches, local organizations, & individuals)
- Decorate your child's bike red, white, & blue and join our bicycle parade unit.
- Join your parade unit immediately following the parade at Depot Square for a community event where will be recognizing our best parade participants and celebrating our Independence Day! Our "Fair @ the Square" will include entertainment, music, food, and children's activities.

Lineup for the parade will begin at 11:00am at the Ford Motor Company parking lot for all parade vehicles. Walking/marching units will lineup on YMCA Drive (off of Sharon Rd.) near the VFW. Step off will begin promptly at NOON. Participants are encouraged to park in the public parking lot located behind Depot Square.

4th on the Loop Parade Candy Distribution

The City of Sharonville's 4th on the Loop Parade is a fantastic community event attended by hundreds of people. One of the highlights of the parade, especially for our younger attendees, is the throwing of candy by parade participants. The throwing of candy can present a safety hazard for parade viewers, as there have been incidents and injuries nationwide as a direct effect of this. Our parade organizers believe that candy distribution can still occur in a safe and cautious manner. We trust that by introducing and communicating these new instructions regarding candy throwing, that everyone will have a safe and fun experience at our parade.

1. Vehicles are to remain in the center of the roadway at all times.
2. Candy must be thrown as far away from the parade unit as possible. Do not throw candy towards the front or rear of the parade unit. *A parade unit is defined as any vehicle, float, or walking unit in the parade.
3. Vehicle drivers are not permitted to throw candy. Candy may only be thrown by passengers of the vehicle.
4. Parade participants under the age of 12 are permitted to throw candy under adult supervision only.
5. Please use caution at all times when on the parade route. Be sure that all members of your parade unit are vigilant and are able to communicate to other members of the group.
