Children begin with breakfast followed by a shopping spree at a local retail store. All students receive a pair of shoes and if needed, a coat. While the children enjoy picking something out for themselves, many shoppers use some of their spending money to purchase gifts for their family members. After shopping, they enjoy a holiday party with games, crafts and pizza. Here, they also have the opportunity to wrap gifts any gifts purchased for their loved ones.

Last year, more than 50 children were under the age of 16 and all had the opportunity to design their own stockings as a craft during the event.
