RENOVATION OF FIRE STATION 87 IS UNDERWAY

Renovation of the fire station located at the corner of Cornell Road & 42 has begun. The anticipated completion is late August/early September. The crew has been relocated during construction. The medic unit will be based out of a house at 10554 Thornview Drive. Engine 87 will operate from Blue Ash Station 13 on Creek Road as part of a partnership to assist us with maintaining our full of services. Response time is either the same or improved for the neighborhoods on the hill.



NEW OFFICERS SWORN IN

In January new officers, Nick Livingston and Mark Mrozek, were sworn in.

Upon graduation from Kettering Fairmont High School, Officer Livingston joined the United States Air Force and was assigned as a military police officer with a Security Forces Squadron. After leaving the Air Force in 2016, he entered the banking industry before beginning his civilian law enforcement career in June 2019. Officer Livingston is a recent graduate of the Great Oaks Police Academy where he spent the first six months of his law enforcement career.

After graduating from Sycamore High School and Scarlet Oaks, Officer Mrozek attended University of Cincinnati and completed an Associate Degree in Criminal Justice. Afterwards he attended the Great Oaks Police Academy and became a certified Police Officer in 2007. He worked for the City of Monroe for 11 years before coming to join the Sharonville Police Department (SPD). Officer Mrozek began with SPD in December 2019 and is halfway through field training.

SHARONVILLE CONVENTION CENTER EXHIBIT HALL TO EXPAND AND NAMED




The Sharonville Convention Center (SCC) will begin construction in March 2020 to expand its facilities. When construction is completed in 2021 the SCC will double its exhibit hall space to 40,000 square feet, add a ticket office, kitchen and additional restrooms and storage.

The new exhibit hall will be named for former Hamilton County Commissioner,

Todd Portune. Portune was a champion for this project. This expansion brings convention business to other areas of the county outside of Downtown Cincinnati.

With the increased space, the SCC will be able to pursue additional business opportunities that previously the SCC was too small to host.

RENOVATIONS OF THE FITNESS CENTER AND LOBBY COMPLETE AT THE SHARONVILLE COMMUNITY CENTER

The features go beyond reconfiguring the lobby and adding 580 square feet and new strength-training machines to the Fitness Center.

- Additional space and equipment for stretching and functional fitness.
- Rubberized flooring throughout the fitness center to help with impact and resistance.
- Multiple adjustable fans throughout the facility to help with improved air flow.
- The new equipment each includes a QR code that can be scanned by the user. The site that it directs the user to includes how to videos and more details on what muscle groups are being exercised.
- Front lobby includes a second set of double doors increasing handicap access.
- Front desk includes a member self-scanner to speed up the process of checking in.
