IMPROVEMENTS PLANNED FOR I-275 INTERCHANGE



In conjunction with the City's Hauck Road Improvement Project (widening the road from 2 to 3 lanes, with a two-way left turn center lane and adding a sidewalk), ODOT will proceed with a safety project of their own on US 42 and on the interstate ramps to/from I-275. This is a preliminary exhibit, showing ODOT's planned improvements. The final layout may change as final design progresses, but anticipated improvements include:

- The addition of a dedicated right-turn lane from US 42 onto Hauck Rd.
- An additional right-turn lane from I-275 westbound onto US 42.
- An additional dedicated left-turn lane (going from one to two) from US 42 onto eastbound I-275
- Realignment of the I-275 eastbound exit ramp to align with the opposing entrance ramp, and elimination of one traffic light.

Both the Hauck Road and the ODOT projects are planned for construction in 2021, and will work together to improve traffic congestion in the Hauck Road / US 42 area.

SHARONVILLE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN 2030 UPDATE

Planning Commission reviewed and approved Resolution 20-01 on July 8, 2020 recommending that the Sharonville City Council approve the Sharonville 2030 Comprehensive Plan update. Council members will hear a presentation on the process, recommendation, goals and priorities of the comprehensive plan at the next council meeting on August 11, 2020 at 7PM.

The last citywide comprehensive plan was adopted in 1984. Since then there have been numerous changes in Sharonville's economy, housing and demographics. The City of Sharonville 2030 Comprehensive Plan has taken into account public input, local census and economic data, and changing regional traffic and transportation patterns to implement goals, recommendations and priorities included in the plan to make sure the community remains a desirable place to live, work and play.


COVID-19 Update
