THE DOGS ON THE COVER ARE CUTE, BUT I KNOW THEY ARE WORKING DOGS. WHAT DO THESE DOGS DO FOR THE CITY OF SHARONVILLE?

Jack is a Belgian Malinois working as a K9 with our Sharonville Police Department and his handler, Officer Lee. He joined our staff in the spring of 2019. Jack is active with both detection and patrol deployments. Though Jack primarily works within Sharonville, he has been deployed to neighboring communities as requested. He has recovered various drugs including cocaine, heroin, methamphetamine and marijuana resulting in finding 10 suspects with 10 arrests in 2020. Well done, Jack!



Sonnet is a Labrador working with our Sharonville Fire Department as an arson dog with her handler, Battalion Chief Ellis. After a six week training program near the end of 2020, she was officially welcomed to our staff in December 2020. Her first request for a scene search was four days later! Canine Sonnet can be utilized to assist investigators with determining if any accelerants were utilized to start a fire. Because she is a federal resource, she is available to any surrounding agencies to assist with locating ignitable liquids in fire scenes. She has been deployed to 19 fire scenes so far. Of those, 10 were determined to be intentionally set. A suspect has been arrested and charged in eight of them. Keep up the good work, Sonnet!

TIPS FOR OPEN BURNS

Now that we are finally enjoying the warmer weather, here are a few reminders. The City of Sharonville does not allow the burning of yard waste such as leaves, sticks, or any other yard debris.

Fire Pits

Fire pits are allowed as long as they are UL approved. These fire pits are not allowed to be within 15 feet of any structure or combustible material. A stone fire pit is allowed, but it cannot be larger than three feet in diameter and no higher than two feet. It must be kept at least 25 feet from any structure or combustible material. Yard waste is not to be burned in either one; only seasoned wood may be burned. Fire pits are allowed to be used as long as it does not become a nuisance. If a complaint is received, we will investigate and may require the fire to be extinguished.



Charcoal Grills

It is grilling season! If you use a charcoal grill, make sure that the coals are out before discarding them. Even if you let them sit overnight, there still may be hot embers embedded in the ashes that you may not see. Always wet the ashes down before discarding them in a trash can. There have been many residential house fires caused by ashes being put into plastic/rubber trash cans. This same advice goes for the ashes from a fireplace. It is always better to take a few extra minutes to make sure everything is out and avoid the chance of having a fire.

VACATIONING? REMEMBER THESE TIPS WHEN YOU LEAVE HOME

This summer will be a time for many to finally take long-awaited vacations. Consider these home security tips prior to your departure in order to insure that you arrive home relaxed and refreshed AND to a secure residence.


Before Leaving:

- Close and lock doors and windows.
- Make sure your residence looks lived in, not empty.
- Leave shades and blinds in a normal position.
- Ask a neighbor to watch your residence while you are away.
- Leave your vacation address and telephone number with a neighbor so you can be reached in case of an emergency.
- Test your smoke and burglar alarms.
- Stop all deliveries or arrange for a neighbor to pick up your mail, newspaper and packages.
- Arrange for someone to mow your lawn, rake leaves and maintain the yard to give the home a lived-in (and cared for) look.
- Have a neighbor place garbage cans at the curb on your normal pickup day(s) and return them after the garbage pickup is made.
- Plug in timers to turn lights and a radio or television on and off at appropriate times.
- If you have call forwarding on your telephone, forward your calls to a trusted friend or relative.
- Don't announce your absence on phone messages; leave your normal message on the machine/voicemail. Additionally don't announce your absence on social media.
- Ask a neighbor to occasionally park in your driveway. If you leave your car at home, park it as you normally would. Vehicles parked outside should be moved occasionally to appear that they are being used.
- Consider taking valuables to a bank safety deposit box.
- Ask local police to place your home on their vacation check list. Sharonville Police provide this service at no charge.

BUILDING PERMITS & ZONING APPROVAL

Typical projects requiring a Building Permit or Zoning Certificate include, but are not limited to:

- Attached or detached garages
- Building additions
- Building remodeling
- Decks/porches
- Demolitions
- Driveways (both a zoning certificate and a curb cut/driveway apron permit are required from Public Works)
- Electric
- Fences
- Fire alarms and suppression systems
- Gutters and downspouts
- Heating Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC)
- New residential construction
- Parking lot
- Portable storage units
- Retaining walls
- Roofs, re-roofing
- Sheds or storage buildings
- Siding
- Signage
- Swimming pools, above ground and in-ground
- Tents
- Window or door replacements (if structural alterations will change the size of the openings)

Call with questions or to check zoning to make sure the proposed work is allowed.

To obtain a permit, please complete an application for plan and/or sign approval. You can either pick-up an application from Community Development's office or download a copy from the City's website.

Submit the completed application, along with three (3) sets of construction plans/

drawings required for your project to the Community Development Department. Applications and plans can also be dropped off to the Community Development Department. There is a drop off/pick up bin conveniently located right outside the office door!

Application fees are no longer due upfront. You will be contacted within 1-2 weeks, once your plans have been approved, for payment. Cash, check, and/or credit payments are accepted. Be advised there is an additional 3.5% processing fee for credit cards.



ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATIONS COMING SOON TO SHARONVILLE CONVENTION CENTER

The City of Sharonville applied to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for grant funding to help fund the installation of publicly available Level 2 Electric Vehicle (EV) charging stations within the City. The City was awarded funding for EV charging stations at the Sharonville Convention Center in the amount of \$22,500. The generous grant funding will support the installation of two new dual-port Level 2 EV charging stations, providing four publicly accessible EV charging stations at the City's Convention Center.

Conveniently located on Chester Road in the City's Northern Lights Entertainment District, the Sharonville Convention Center is elated to be a host site for the new EV charging stations. The intention is that this public amenity will better serve the needs of hotel and convention center visitors or really anyone who lives, works, and plays in the City of Sharonville.

The grant will help improve Ohioans' access to EV charging infrastructure, and the City of Sharonville is thrilled to be a grant recipient of this exciting initiative. While the details of the implementation timeline are still in the works, the expectation is that

the EV charging stations will be installed at the City's Convention Center before the end of 2021.

COLLABORATION LEADS TO PLANS FOR SHARON CREEK

To show support for the proposed multi-use recreational trail, the Sharonville City Council approved a Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Sharonville and the Sharon Creek Collaborative. The MOU is a shared agreement between the collaborative members to plan for, construct, and maintain the Sharon Creek Multi-Use Trail. Members of the collaborative include the Village of Evendale, Great Parks of Hamilton County, Mill Creek Conservancy District, Mill Creek Alliance, Connecting Active Communities Coalition, Tri-State Trails, and the City of Sharonville. The SCC is leading the effort to acquire land, plan, and construct a multi-use recreational trail, including stream bank restoration along Sharon Creek through the Village of Evendale and the City of Sharonville.


Great Parks of Hamilton County plans to apply for funding to acquire properties in Sharonville through the Clean Ohio Green Space Conservation Program. The grant application would be for acquiring approximately 8.5 acres of land along the east bank of Sharon Creek in the Village of Evendale and the City of Sharonville from Glendale Milford Road to Sharon Road, as well as a small portion of land located behind a City-owned parking lot. All of the property subject to the grant application is currently owned by Norfolk Southern Railroad and has been determined as excess real estate.

Long-term the SCC members seek to do the following:

- Work cooperatively with adjacent land owners in the acquisition of the trail parcel and easement and throughout the planning process.
- Support efforts coordinated by Tri-State Trails to fund the development of the Sharon Creek Trail Action Plan.
- Create and agree to a final design/concept plan and determine

an opinion of probable costs for the construction, maintenance, and long-term upkeep of the trail parcel and easement.

- Work together in a strategic and coordinated effort to secure grants and other sources of funding to support the construction of the trail and restoration of the stream.
- Participate in efforts to assemble local funding to match state, federal, and/or other grant opportunities as needed for the trail and stream projects.

SPRING & SUMMER SERVICES CONTINUE

The Sharonville Public Works Department continues to work through the COVID-19 pandemic by offering all normal services to the residents and businesses in the city including the following:

- Brush and Special Construction Material collection
- Trash and Recycling collection
- Truck Loan Program (April through October)
- Street sweeping, repairs and maintenance
- Maintenance of traffic signals, street lights and street signs
- Storm Sewer maintenance and repairs
- Parks and Ball Field maintenance and mowing

SHARONVILLE RESIDENTS RECYCLED 762 TONS IN 2020

Congratulations to all the residents who recycled in 2020. On average, each household in Sharonville recycled 381 pounds – that's 14% of all waste collected in Sharonville in 2020.

TAX DEPARTMENT



IF YOU FORGOT TO FILE YOUR SHARONVILLE TAX RETURN

We suggest you file as soon as possible. You can still mail the return, or make an appointment to stop by our office for assistance. Continuing to delay filing will only increase possible penalties.

EXPECTING A REFUND?

Refunds are processed in the order received. You should expect a response to arrive within 90 days.

RECEIVED A LETTER ASKING FOR MORE DOCUMENTS?

If we didn't receive all the required documents (W-2s or federal forms) we send a request for them to verify the data on your tax return. Please send the requested information in as soon as possible so your tax return can be completed. Failure to send in these documents can result in lost credits, late filing fees, or additional charges if a payment is subsequently due.

EXTENSION DUE DATE

All local tax returns with a Federal extension are due by October 15, 2021. A copy of the extension should accompany the filed tax return. Extensions only extend the time allowed to file a tax return, they do not extend the payment due dates.

AM I REQUIRED TO PAY ESTIMATED TAXES?

All individuals and businesses that reasonably expect to owe \$200 or more due to taxable income, after subtracting credits from withholding by an employer, are required to estimate and pay the tax during the year the income is earned.

If you owe less than \$200 but still wish to make estimated payments you may do so at any time. You may increase or decrease your estimated taxes at any time by notifying us in writing.

2nd quarter payments were due by June 15, 2021. Invoices will be sent twice this year for the 3rd and 4th quarter payments which are due on September 15, 2021 and January 17, 2022. Failure to pay at least 90% of your 2021 tax liability by January 17, 2022 may result in a 15% penalty.

SCHOOL DISTRICT TAX

The City of Sharonville is within the Princeton City School District. The code for state income tax form purposes is 3116.

HOW DO I PAY MY TAX?

Bi-monthly invoices are sent for all tax balances. If you have questions regarding any balance due please call, we're happy to help.

Check or money order payments may be mailed in and should be made payable to "City of Sharonville Tax".

Payments by check, money order, cash, or credit card are accepted at the tax office.

Payments may also be made through ACI Payments either online (a link is available on our website Sharonville.org) or by phone at 1-800-487-4567. ACI Payments does charge a nominal fee for this service which may be calculated using the fee calculator available.

PROPERTY TAXES

The collections of property taxes (whether it is for residential property or business property) are the responsibility of Hamilton County or Butler County. **The City of Sharonville does not receive property tax dollars from city residents or businesses and is proud that a municipal property tax has not been levied in over 30 years.**

Community Center Access Policy

Every person entering the Community Center must stop at the Customer Service Desk to state his/her purpose of coming to the Community Center. If you are a member, please make sure to scan your membership card each time you enter the Community Center and Pool. In order to be as safe as possible and pursuant to City of Sharonville Ordinance Number 2014-13, ALL resident and non-resident guests, ages 18 years and older, purchasing a guest pass will be required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID card. This card will be scanned by the "Safe Point" System against the National Sex Offenders Registry.

The entire membership card data base is scanned through the "Safe Point" system twice a year. New members and renewal members joining the Community Center will be scanned before membership cards are given to the members. Should your driver's license or state ID card match a National or State Sexual Offender Registry record or if you do not provide a valid driver's license or state ID card, you will not be permitted to enter the facility. There is an appeal process.

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on Recreation property without permit from the Recreation Director. This includes but is not limited to parks, shelters, Community Center, pools, and parking lots.

Stay & Play Zone

The Stay & Play Zone is available for children ages 1-9 while their parent/guardian works out or participates in a program. Nursery service is FREE for children who have a current Combo Membership. The fee for those without a membership is \$3.00 per child per hour. Maximum of 6 children at one time. Supervision & Guest Policy *Guest Fee is \$5 per Person

Our goal in this policy is to accommodate our members as best as we can, without creating a potentially unsafe or unfair usage of the facility.

- Members age 10 & over may enter the Community Center by themselves. Members under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult member, age 18+.
- The fee for a member to bring a guest is \$5.00 per person. Guests ages 2 & under are not subject to a fee.
- Members ages 10 to 17 are permitted to bring no more than 2 guests per day.
- Adult members over the age of 18 are permitted to bring up to 5 guests per day. If the guests are from the same family as the member, they are permitted to bring more than 5.
- Example: An adult member over the age of 18 is bringing their adult daughter, son-in-law, and five grandchildren from out of town to visit the pool. Since all guests are from the same family as the member, this would be permitted.

- Members are responsible for the behavior of their guests while they are in our facility. The Recreation Department reserves the right to ban future entry.
- All guests are required to complete the guest sign in sheet when entering the Community Center.
- Guests are required to leave the facility with the member once they have completed their activity.
- Discounted guest pass bundles can be purchased at the Community Center front desk only. Purchase 5 guest passes in advance for only \$20.00 and 10 in advance for only \$35.00.

Refund Policy

Membership and class refunds will only be given in cases of medical circumstances, if the member moves, or if the class is canceled. (A doctor's note may be required.) Refunds are obtained by filling out proper paperwork at the Customer Service Desk. Checks will be sent to your residence within four weeks. If paid by a credit card, refunds will be credited back to the card that was used for the transaction.




