
## Department Budget






We are so excited to announce that today was MOVING DAY! You can now handle all police business, 24 hours a day, at our new building located at 3639 E. Kemper Road.

## \*Sharonville Police Announce Arrest in Homicide Investigation\*

The Sharonville Police Department is pleased to announce that we have arrested **Anthony Holley, Jr.** for the murder of Michael Brice in Sharonville on May 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Holley is a 28 year-old man from Colerain Township, Ohio. On May 3<sup>rd</sup>, Holley approached Brice at the Rally's drive-thru. The brief confrontation ended with Holley shooting Brice multiple times before fleeing in his 1997 Ford Thunderbird.

We would like to express our condolences to Brice's family as they deal with this senseless death. We would also like to express our gratitude to neighboring agencies that assisted us in this investigation. In particular: Evendale Police, Blue Ash Police, Glendale Police, Springdale Police, and Forest Park Police.

# Use of Force Review

A review of the use of force incidents that occurred in 2021 has been completed.


Of the 456 arrests made in 2021, there were 16 (3.5%) incidents where force was applied. Some incidents had more than one type of force applied.

**One suspect received medical treatment as a result of force being applied.**

**Five officers received injuries during these incidents requiring medical treatment and/or time off work.**

# Criminal Investigations



## Significant Cases

- Homicide – Suspect shot wife’s boyfriend multiple times while waiting at Rally’s Drive Thru. Suspect was arrested for Murder and wife was arrested for Obstructing. Case is still pending in court.
- Felonious Assault – Ex-boyfriend shot at victim. Detectives proved the case. Case is still pending in court.
- Felonious Assault – Suspect under the influence of drugs entered Mi Tierra and stabbed several people. Case is still pending in court.
- Felonious Assault – Three subjects shot, four suspects identified, two identified as the shooters. Victims failed to cooperated, therefore Prosecutor’s office refused to present to the Grand Jury.
- Kidnapping/Theft of Motor Vehicle – Suspect took vehicle while mother was in the store, child was in the vehicle in a car seat. Suspect left child at Good Samaritan Hospital. Suspect was arrested. Case is still pending in court.
- Rape of 13 year old. Indictment is pending.
- Burglary – elderly victim had vehicle stolen. Shoe print was lifted, two suspects identified, arrested and convicted.


## Top 25 Requesting Agencies



## Deployments by Month




## Deployments by Day of Week










