Electric Aggregation Benefits



You may have seen the headlines that Duke Energy electric bills are expected to hit an 8-year high this summer in Ohio. For those in our Sharonville Electric Aggregation program, they will not be affected by Duke Energy's electric supply rate increase this summer. This is great news!

Sharonville's aggregation fixed rate is 4.72 cents/kWh. Duke's standard service residential supply rate beginning in June and through the summer is estimated to be about 8.9 cents/kWh. Participating aggregations members can expect to save almost 50% off the utility supply price for the coming summer. They typical home can expect to save around \$40/month on their electric supply as opposed to taking supply from Duke.

Electric pricing has two components: supply and transmission/distribution. The City can only contract through aggregation for the supply component. Transmission/distribution must be handled and billed solely by the utility. If you'd like to join the aggregation program, contact the City's energy broker, The Utilities Group, at 513-481-7954.
