Ribbon Cutting Celebration for Sharonville Convention Center EXPANSION

Doors are open for the expansion at Sharonville Convention Center featuring the Todd Portune Exhibit Hall. This expansion doubles our exhibit space, adds a restaurant and bar, grab-and-go market and features 30 foot ceilings with the opportunity to host sports tournaments.

Our new larger suburban convention center comes at an opportune time. Duke Energy Convention Center is about to close for a planned 18-month renovation. As a result, our convention center is expected to see a boost in occupancy as it absorbs some additional events. With the expansion, the maximum building occupancy has increased from 3,200 to 5,000.

New events include Bridalrama, the Greater Cincinnati Comic Expo, Wendy's Bridal Show, and several organization banquets.

The hall is named after the late Hamilton County commissioner who was a supporter and driving force behind both expansions.
