Not many people can say that they voluntarily associated themselves with one thing or person for 50 years. When it happens, we celebrate such a remarkable feat – like a couple's golden wedding anniversary. With great appreciation, the City of Sharonville honored Paul Kattelman at our annual Employee Recognition for reaching this significant milestone. Paul has served the City of Sharonville for 50 years and thus has earned his well-deserved retirement from city service beginning this July.



In June 1971, Paul became a member of our City Council and began his lengthy career of service to our community. He would go on to become President of Council and our City's Mayor from 1991 through 1996. In the most recent years, with his significant background in public employment, Paul has led the City of Sharonville's Civil Service Commission. In that role, Paul has assisted in shaping the public workforce for not just our City but also the Princeton City School District.

Paul is a 1962 graduate of Princeton High School – where he has been honored as a Distinguished Alumnus. He and his wife, Janey, have been staples of our community for over six decades watching and raising their children, grandchildren, and now great-grandchildren. I give thanks to Paul for his 50 years of service to our residents, businesses, and employees.

It is only fitting that earlier this year we opened our latest expansion of our Sharonville Convention Center. Paul was our Mayor when the original vision of a public convention center on Chester Road became a reality 30 years ago. With an additional 20,000 square feet of exhibition space, our Northern Lights District will continue to attract conventions and meetings from around the region. The new renovation will further our legacy as THE place to live, work and play to which former Mayor Paul Kattelman's 50 years of service has so significantly contributed.

I SAW A RECENT NEWS REPORT THAT HAD ME CONCERNED. HOW CAN RESIDENTS BE INFORMED IF A SEX OFFENDER MOVES INTO THEIR NEIGHBORHOOD?

LOCAL 12 News recently reported on communities in the region where sex offenders are living too close to schools and day care centers against Ohio Law (limitation of 1,000 feet). Fortunately, we do not have this issue in Sharonville.

Those who watched that news coverage may be wondering how they can learn whether a sex offender moves onto their street or in their neighborhood.

The State of Ohio has a website, <https://ohio.gov/residents/resources/sex-offender-search>, where searches can be conducted. At that site, residents can also input their email addresses for notification purposes. Other useful information is available as well.



HAS THE CITY TAKEN ANY SAFETY MEASURES AT THE COMMUNITY CENTER, GIVEN THE HIGH NUMBER OF CHILDREN THAT USE THAT FACILITY?

Yes. To help enhance safety at the Community Center, a decade ago, the City passed Ordinance 2014-13, prohibiting registered sex offenders from being members at the Center. The Ordinance also applies to guests of members. The Community Center uses a software program that monitors the above. Policies and procedures are detailed on page 17.

POLICE DEPARTMENT



BUILDING COMMUNITY RELATIONSHIPS

Officers of Sharonville Police Department are committed to community engagement and to making every effort to build positive relationships with our community members that we so proudly serve.

Some of the programs that accomplish this mission include our Citizens Police Academy, Junior Police Academy, D.A.R.E. Program, station tours, open houses, meet and greets, Shop with A Cop, workplace violence/active killer trainings for local businesses/groups/places of worship to name a few.

Our Citizens Police Academy was relaunched in 2023 and we plan on having another one later this year. More details to come on this!



Our D.A.R.E. program is taught in all our elementary schools and is primarily taught to 5th and 6th grade students. This program not only teaches these kids about the dangers of drug and alcohol use, but also emphasizes other key skills such as recognizing peer pressure and how to resist negative peer pressure, risks and consequences, positive ways to deal with stressful situations, the basics of communication, non-verbal communication and effective listening, how to recognize and safely report bullying, the importance of helping others, how to get help from others when needed, the importance of being a good citizen and how to make safe and responsible decisions. The relationships that are formed between the officers, students and school staff are priceless!

JUNIOR POLICE ACADEMY TO RETURN

It is our plan, in partnership with the Sharonville Community Center, to bring back our Junior Police Academy this summer. This program will be offered to our young residents and our hope is that we can give these kids an age-appropriate look at the day-to-day operations of the police department and the different aspects of law enforcement.



This will be an interactive program for these kids with many valuable lessons being taught during each class. Children will try on and use real police equipment, meet the K-9 unit, tour S.W.A.T. vehicles, meet and interact with several of our officers and more! One of the classes will be held at the Sharonville Police Department, where children can take a tour of the station, meet the command staff and much more. One entire class is devoted to teaching children personal safety and self-defense.

Registration will be open soon for 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade children. Check our social media and website for more information.

ADDITIONAL TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES & OUTREACH

Our department also offers workplace violence/active killer/situational awareness trainings to any business, schools, places of worship and other groups. This training educates those on the history of workplace violence/active killer incidents, the importance of situational awareness, suggestions on how to improve situational awareness not only in the workplace but in everyday life and tools to help reduce the risk and impact of workplace violence/active killer incidents.

We also love to come to other types of gatherings and spend some time with your group, whether it be neighborhood block parties, boy scout/girl scout meetings or many other types of gathering. We are always open to giving any group tours of the police department.

CODE ENFORCEMENT REMINDERS

Residents are encouraged to be cognizant of the visual aesthetics of their properties and potential negative impacts on abutting properties.

OUTDOOR STORAGE IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS

Storing materials out in the open can create unsightly views and negatively impact neighboring properties. Per Section 1113.09 of the Sharonville Zoning Code entitled PARKING, OPEN STORAGE OF SUPPLIES, MATERIAL & EQUIPMENT, AND ACCUMULATION OF WASTE PROHIBITED lists materials that are not allowed to be stored outside in the open on residential properties. Materials must be in a fully enclosed building, not visible from the street or adjacent property, and not within an open carport.



The ordinance prohibits the open storage of materials and equipment to remain or accumulate on a residential property, including but not limited to:

- Building and construction materials, or lawn equipment
- Trash, junk, or any scrap materials such as automobile, trailer or vehicle chassis, parts, tires or sections
- Household appliances
- Lumber
- Scrap iron, old metal, pipe, conduit, rope
- Plastic, bottles, paper/paperboard, styrofoam, rags,
- Furniture
- Other waste materials

Certain items listed above may be recycled at Cohen Recycling - Sharonville location at 12175 Reading Road. Some items and/or materials may be subject to a small processing fee. For more information call 513-733-0606 or visit www.cohenusa.com.

HIGH GRASS AND WEEDS

The City of Sharonville Codified Ordinances Section 521.13 states grass over eight (8") inches in height is considered a nuisance and must be cut.

When the City receives a complaint, an inspection is made to confirm the suspected violation. If a violation is confirmed, a notice of the violation is sent to the offending property. If the tall grass is not mowed within seven days of the post date, the City will send the Public Works Department to the property to cut the grass. Total costs incurred by the City to cut the grass – including time and equipment used – can quickly add up.

The minimum charge for the City to mow an offending property is **\$250.00**. Depending on the the area to be mowed and the height of the grass, the costs can be much higher. The costs associated with mowing the offending property are **billed directly to the property owner**. If the property owner fails to pay the dues to the City within 30 days, the City will include the total costs to the Official Tax Duplicate in the form of a lien on the offending property.



SPRING & SUMMER SERVICES

TRUCK LOAN PROGRAM

- Available mid-April through October for large trash disposal.
- The truck will be brought to your home or business by 3 PM and picked up the next morning by 7:30 AM.
- A release of liability must be signed by the property owner at least 24 hours before the scheduled rental day.
- Cost for homeowners is \$50 a night and \$60 for the weekend; for businesses it is \$90 for nights and weekends.
- Call to schedule a truck starting April 1.

BRUSH AND SPECIAL PICK-UP SERVICE

- Curbside Brush and Special Pickup is a FREE year round service to residents.
- Residents must call by Friday **BEFORE 5 PM** to be on a list for pick up the following week.
- Twigs cannot be picked up. They are yard waste and must be disposed of with your regular garbage pick-up.



INSTALLING A NEW DRIVEWAY

- You must obtain a permit to install a new driveway from the Community Development Department – cost is \$40.
- There is no fee or permit required to install a driveway apron. It must be inspected at least 24 hours prior to pouring the cement.
- Call Public Works before constructing a driveway or apron for specifications and inspection requirements.

YARD WASTE

Grass, weeds, twigs, and leaves can be disposed of using one of the following methods:

- Composting on your property.
- Placing yard waste and garden waste in bags or cans at the curb with regular trash collection.
- Separate yard & garden waste from your regular trash and take the yard waste to one of the three recycling drop-off locations for residents of Hamilton County (free service). For more information call YARDWASTE HOTLINE at 513-946-7755.
- Do NOT blow grass clippings or leaves into the street as these waste materials clog storm drains.

GOLDEN VIEW ACRES

Golden View Acres is a 52-unit Senior Retirement Village located on Greensfelder Lane off Thornview Drive. To be eligible for tenancy, a person must be at least 57 years of age and a current Sharonville resident for at least one year; or be a parent, grandparent, brother or sister of a current Sharonville resident who has resided in the City for one year.



Golden View Acres has both first and second floor units and one and two bedroom apartments. Each apartment has an equipped kitchen with stove and refrigerator, gas heat, hot water, and air conditioning. Tenants pay their own utilities except water. There are coin operated laundry facilities in each of the three buildings. The complex is a "Smoke Free" facility. After signing a lease agreement, **THE RENT IS NOT RAISED** unless an additional tenant occupies the same apartment or the current tenant moves to another apartment in the complex. At that time, a new rental agreement is then drawn up at the current rate.

To be placed on a **WAITING LIST** to rent an apartment, a written application must be made and a \$50 fee deposited. This fee is refundable when you rent an apartment or request in writing to be taken off the Waiting List.

2024 STREET REPAIR PROGRAM

Includes curb and sidewalk repairs or replacement and total street re-paving for the following streets: Hawk, Haverstraw, Jenkins, Mulligan, Bainbridge, and Carriagelite.

Filing Due Dates

Individual Returns: On or before **April 15, 2024**

FILING DUE DATES FOR BUSINESSES

Net Profit Business Returns: On or before **April 15, 2024** or the 15th day of the 4th month following the end of the fiscal year.

Withholding Reconciliations: On or before February 29, 2024.

DO I NEED TO FILE A TAX RETURN?

Yes, if any of the following apply:

- You are a resident of Sharonville 18 years old or older, regardless of your income level.
- You are under 18 years old and have earned income.
- You are a non-resident who works within the City of Sharonville and your income is not fully withheld by an employer.
- You are engaged in a business within the City of Sharonville and have sales, perform services or own rental property, whether or not tax is due.
- Your business is located within or doing business within the City of Sharonville.
- Fill in forms are available on our web site at www.sharonville.org/DocumentCenter/Index/61 under Individual Tax Forms.

WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING WITH ME OR SEND IN WITH MY SHARONVILLE TAX RETURN?

1. **W-2 form(s)** which include amounts in box 1, 3 and 5, as well as all copies including local withholding in boxes 18, 19 and 20.
2. **Federal 1040 tax return** including:
 - Schedule 1, C, E, F and/or 4797 if applicable
 - Documentation for any income reported on your Federal tax form as "other income" (line 8 on the Federal 1040)
 - Any other federal schedules or forms which document deductions or additions to your local tax return
3. Copies of other local tax returns or refund requests you've filed

NEW TAX LAWS BEGINNING IN 2024

- **Taxation under age 18:** Beginning on January 1, 2024, for tax year 2024 and after, taxpayers under 18 years of age will be exempt from municipal income taxation. This does not exempt them from filing for last year (2023).
- **Automatic One Month Extension:** Business entities receiving a 6-month federal extension now receive an automatic additional one-month extension for their municipal income tax returns. This does not apply to individuals who include business income on their individual Federal 1040 tax return.

WHY DO I HAVE TO INCLUDE MY FEDERAL 1040 FORM?

All cities in the State of Ohio require a copy of your federal 1040 form to be included with your local tax return. This helps us assure we have all the necessary paperwork and are taxing & giving credits for the correct amounts.

HOW DO I PAY MY TAX?

- Check or money order payments may be mailed in and should be made payable to "City of Sharonville Tax".
- Payments by check, money order, cash, or credit card are accepted at the tax office. A fee is charged by the processing company for debit or credit card payments.
- Payments may also be made through ACI Payments, Inc either online at www.sharonville.org or by phone at 1-800-487-4567. ACI Payments does charge a nominal fee for this service which may be calculated using the fee calculator available.
- If your balance has been sent to the Ohio Attorney General all payments must be paid directly to them at P.O. Box 89471, Cleveland OH, 44101. If you have questions, you can contact them at 1-888-871-8838 or visit their web site at www.ohioattorneygeneral.gov.

HOW CAN I GET AN EXTENSION?

If you have received a federal extension to file, you automatically can have an extension with the City of Sharonville until October 15, 2024. A copy of the extension must accompany the filed tax return to avoid penalties. If you do not apply for a federal extension you may request an extension in writing with our office by April 15, 2024. Please remember that an extension to file does not give you an extension to pay your taxes, so be sure to make all payments by April 15th.

WHAT INCOME IS TAXABLE?

- Qualifying wages are defined by the IRS tax code section 3121(a). It includes many different types of income, including but not limited to wages, sick pay, vacation pay, commissions, severance pay, settlements, bonuses, fringe benefits, short-term disability pay, stock options and deferred compensation. It is usually found in Box 5 (Medicare wages) on your W-2, however there are some exceptions.
- Other income (generally listed on line 8 of your Federal 1040 Schedule 1) such as gambling winnings, HSA and scholarship distributions, director's fees, jury duty income and prize winnings.
- The net of all profit and losses from profession and/or business operations.

WHY DO I HAVE TO PAY ESTIMATE PAYMENTS?

All federal, state, and local taxes are due during the year that income is earned. Most companies withhold federal and state taxes from your paychecks, but they may not withhold local income taxes, or may withhold less tax than our 1.5% rate. If a taxpayer reasonably expects to owe \$200 or more due to not having at least 1.5% local tax withheld they need to make estimate payments or may be charged penalties.

If you owe less than \$200, but still wish to make estimated payments please note this on your tax return.

Second quarter estimate payments are due by June 17, 2024. For your convenience a coupon was sent with your 2023 tax return. Invoices will be sent for the 3rd and 4th quarter payments which are due on September 16, 2024 and January 15, 2025.

Walk-ins may be accepted if there are available appointment times.
- We recommend you file early, as the number of people seeking assistance increases dramatically as the tax filing deadline approaches.
- If you have multiple years to file, call to make an appointment.
- For appointments, bring all the required items listed on the previous page.
- Paperwork or check or money order payments may be deposited into the secure drop box to the left of the front door.

WHAT IF I WORKED FROM HOME DURING 2023?

If you worked from home during the tax year 2023, but your employer withheld local income tax to a different location, you can request a refund of local tax withheld by your employer for those days and pay the tax to Sharonville. If a refund is requested your tax credit on line 8 of our IR form will be reduced. Please attach a copy of the refund request with your Sharonville return.

Supreme Court Decision

In 2020 Governor DeWine declared a state of emergency for the State of Ohio due to the pandemic. Part of this legislation allowed employers to continue to tax their employees at their municipal principal place of work. There was a lawsuit filed claiming this was unconstitutional; however, the Ohio Supreme Court has ruled the law was constitutional for Ohio residents.

WHAT INCOME IS EXEMPT FROM TAX?

- Interest, dividends, some royalties
- Capital gains (unless considered ordinary income)
- Alimony
- Military pay and allowances
- Proceeds from qualified IRS defined retirement plans
- Social Security benefits, welfare benefits, unemployment insurance benefits, workers' compensation

This information regarding income is not all encompassing. Please contact our office if you have questions regarding the taxability of specific types of income.

PROPERTY TAXES

The collections of property taxes (whether it is for residential property or business property) are the responsibility of Hamilton County or Butler County. **The City of Sharonville does not receive property tax dollars from city residents or businesses and is proud that a municipal property tax has not been levied in over 30 years.** For further information on the collection and payment of property taxes, please contact either the Hamilton County Auditor's office at (513) 946-4000 or the Butler County Auditor's office at (513) 887-3154. Links to these offices are available on the Sharonville website.

SCHOOL DISTRICT TAX

The City of Sharonville is within the Princeton City School District. The code for state income tax form purposes is 3116.

MOST COMMONLY MADE ERRORS

- Not attaching the required forms – W-2(s), Federal 1040 & Schedule 1:
In addition to your Federal 1040 we need your W-2(s) and if you file a Schedule 1, we will need a copy of it as well as any included additional schedules (C, E, F and/or 4797). This will clarify the income reported on the Schedule 1 and eliminate unnecessary correspondence.
- Net Operating Losses:
Businesses, including individuals filing Schedules C, E, and/or F, no longer have limitations on the amount of carried-forward losses they can use. For 2023 businesses may use 100% of any losses carried forward from 2018 through 2022.
- Too Much Credit for Other Municipalities:
Credit for taxes withheld or paid to another municipality is available to residents. It is limited to 1.5% of the amount of W-2 wages taxed to another municipality, and no amounts exceeding the 1.5% limit will be credited toward additional taxable income. Credits for taxes paid for business income are also limited to 1.5% and are pro-rated based on percentage of total business income. Documentation is required for any credit. We added Worksheet A on the back of your Sharonville income tax return to help you calculate this credit. There are no credits given for county, mental health, or school taxes paid.



Si usted es víctima de un crimen violento en este país, posiblemente calificaría para la Visa U si se comunica con la policía para reportar el incidente y coopera con ellos en la investigación del incidente. Por ejemplo, necesitaría proporcionar toda la información que tenga del crimen, su información biográfica y continuar disponible en la investigación del crimen. Los oficiales del orden público no arrestan a las víctimas de crímenes, no están interesados en el estatus inmigratorio de la víctima, solo están enfocados en ayudar y proteger a las víctimas de crimen. Reporta los crímenes al 911 o acude a la policía más cercana.

PARKING VIOLATIONS INFRACCIONES DE TRÁNSITO

Las siguientes son infracciones de tránsito, causadas por estacionar un vehículo indebidamente, previstas en el Reglamento de la Ciudad de Sharonville. Es ilegal estacionar un vehículo:

- Sobre una acera/banqueta o en el área entre la acera/banqueta y la cuneta de la calle.
- Frente a un acceso peatonal o vehicular, público o privado, en una zona residencial, o a menos de 3 (tres) pies de distancia de un acceso peatonal o vehicular, público o privado, en una zona comercial.
- En una calle por más de 24 (veinticuatro) horas consecutivas.
- Sin dejar 1 (un) pie de distancia entre los otros vehículos estacionados.
- A menos de 10 (diez) pies de distancia de un hidrante de incendios.
- En cualquier lugar donde la señalización vial prohíba detener el vehículo o estacionarse, o en cualquier lugar donde la cuneta esté pintada de amarillo.

Al recibir quejas sobre un vehículo mal estacionado, nuestros oficiales intentarán contactar al propietario del vehículo, y simplemente le darán a conocer el reglamento de tránsito, y le solicitarán mover su vehículo.

Si no puede pagar la multa, y quiere solicitar el diferimiento de la audiencia se le permitirá hacerlo por una sola vez. Para solicitar el diferimiento de la audiencia tendrá que presentarse en la Oficina del Tribunal del Alcalde (3639 East Kemper Road), con una identificación y firmar dicha solicitud. La solicitud para diferir su audiencia debe hacerse por usted en persona antes de la fecha de la misma. No realizar el pago o presentarse en la corte el día de la audiencia asignada resultará en una orden de arresto, costos adicionales, y la posible pérdida de la licencia de conducir. No todos los casos requieren que se presente en la corte, pero si se presenta, ya sea obligatorio o no, se le proporcionará un intérprete sin costo. Las audiencias comienzan puntualmente a las 4:00 PM. 

Community Center Access Policy

Every person entering the Community Center must stop at the Customer Service Desk to state his/her purpose of coming to the Community Center. If you are a member, please make sure to scan your membership card each time you enter the Community Center and Pool. In order to be as safe as possible and pursuant to City of Sharonville Ordinance Number 2014-13, ALL resident and non-resident guests, ages 18 years and older, purchasing a guest pass will be required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID Card. This card will be scanned against the National Sex Offenders Registry.

New members and renewal members joining the Community Center will be scanned before membership cards are given to the members. Should your driver's license or state ID card match a National or State Sexual Offender Registry record or if you do not provide a valid driver's license or state ID card, you will not be permitted to enter the facility. There is an appeal process.

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on Recreation property without permit from the Recreation Director. This includes but is not limited to parks, shelters, Community Center, pools and parking lots.



Stay & Play Zone

The Stay & Play Zone is available for children ages 1-6 while their parent/guardian works out or participates in a program. Nursery service is FREE for children who have a current Combo Membership. The fee for those without a membership is \$3.00 per child per hour. Maximum 2 hours per day. We can accommodate 6 children per hour. A waitlist will be implemented if we reach our maximum capacity at any time.

Supervision & Guest Policy

Community Center & Aquatics Facilities

*Guest Fee is \$5 per Person

Our goal in this policy is to accommodate our members as best as we can, without creating a potentially unsafe or unfair usage of the facility.

- Members age 10 & over may enter the Community Center or Pool by themselves. Members under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult member, age 18+.
- The fee for a member to bring a guest is \$5.00 per person. Guests ages 2 & under are not subject to a fee.
- Members ages 10 to 17 are permitted to bring no more than 2 guests per day.
- Adult members over the age of 18 are permitted to bring up to 5 guests per day. If the guests are from the same family as the member, they are permitted to bring more than 5.
- Example: An adult member over the age of 18 is bringing their adult daughter, son in law, and five grandchildren from out of town to visit the pool. Since all guests are from the same family as the member, this would be permitted.
- All guests over the age of 18 are required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID to be scanned by our SafePoint system against the National Sex Offenders Registry.
- Members are responsible for the behavior of their guests while they are in our facility. The Recreation Department reserves the right to ban future entry.
- All guests are required to complete the guest sign in sheet when entering the Community Center.
- Guests are required to leave the facility with the member once they have completed their activity.
- Discounted guest pass bundles can be purchased at the Community Center front desk only. Purchase 5 guest passes in advance for only \$20.00 and 10 in advance for only \$35.00.




