

# Message from the Mayor



As we enter 2025, I want to take a moment to talk about one of the most frequent questions I've received over the last year ... "What's going on with the city-owned properties in our downtown Loop?" So, here goes ...

In the Spring of 2024, our beloved Cliff's Hardware closed its door after ownership decided it was time and reached out to sell the property to the City, knowing that it would be in good hands for the future of Sharonville. Council decided to proceed with that purchase. Two additional property acquisitions presented themselves on the Loop – the corners of Creek and Reading and Main and Cornell – that the City chose to move forward on obtaining. Having a say in what develops on these critical entry/focal points of our downtown Loop is essential to revitalizing this area for the years to come.

The City has been actively pursuing opportunities to use these spaces for the betterment of the community. Specifically, we sought requests for proposals to develop the Cliff's Hardware space and are in the process of reviewing our options. We are not in a rush. We believe that getting this development "right" is more important than getting it done "fast." We are bullish on our prospects to find the right complement to our existing downtown success stories and revitalize the entire downtown Loop.

As evidenced by our infrastructure investment at the Depot Square, the continued streetscape improvements planned for Reading Road and Main Street, and new programming added to the area like Bark & Buy, Loop Quest, and our Tree Lighting ceremony, the City has prioritized transforming this part of Sharonville for generations to come. In keeping with our Comprehensive Sharonville 2030 Plan, we will continue, through a thoughtful and strategic manner, to acquire properties and work with stakeholders in the area to move these goals forward. Thank you for your patience. Thank you for supporting our small businesses that already make Sharonville home. Thank you for your participation in our community. We are excited about the future and the opportunities that exist to solidify Sharonville as THE place to Live, Work and Play.

## AS A RESIDENT OF SHARONVILLE, AM I BILLED FOR AMBULANCE SERVICE WHEN IT COMES TO MY HOME FOR AN EMERGENCY?

Residents who need ambulance service are NOT responsible for any out-of-pocket expenses regarding these services; however, their insurance company will still receive a bill requesting their portion of the payment. The payment received from the resident's insurance payment will be accepted as full payment. This is referred to as tax-based billing.

On the other hand, non-residents transported by the City of Sharonville Fire Department will be billed normally for ambulance services. They are responsible for whatever portion of the bill their insurance company does not cover.

The City of Sharonville Fire Department does not charge for calls for assistance that do not result in transport for both residents and non-residents.

## DOES THE CITY OF SHARONVILLE PROCESS ITS OWN MEDICAL BILLS?

No. The City of Sharonville Fire Department uses Medicount Management, a third-party billing company, to process all EMS billing. The company is based in Evendale and can be reached locally at (800) 962-1484. Any resident or non-resident with an EMS billing question can call Medicount Management or the Sharonville Fire Department at 513-563-0252.

# POLICE DEPARTMENT

## K9 JACK – EOW – NOVEMBER 2, 2024

It is with heavy hearts that the Sharonville Police Department announces the passing of our beloved K9, Jack. Jack suffered some medical complications after he underwent emergency surgery. He was transferred to the CARE Center where he received intensive treatment. He then suffered another medical complication. Sgt. Lee and his medical team made the extremely difficult decision to relieve Jack of his pain and suffering.

Jack apprehended numerous subjects and assisted in countless investigations since he started with SPD in 2019. Jack was purchased from Shallow Creek Kennels in Sharpsville, Pennsylvania. He was a Belgian Malinois born in the Czech Republic and was purchased through the generous support of The Matt Haverkamp Foundation. He was #59 for the foundation and was dual purpose narcotics detection and tracking K9.

Aside from being an incredible asset to our department, he was a part of our police family. Sgt. Lee and his wife took Jack into their home and gave him a beautiful life. We are so thankful to them for taking such great care of Jack for the last several years.

## ICE SAFETY & RESCUE

As we head into Winter weather, just a reminder that ponds will ice over. Sharonville Fire Dept has ice rescue equipment and trains annually for these types of rescues. SFD understands pets are valued family members too. SFD will attempt to save any pets that fall through the ice. Please do not attempt to rescue the person or pet yourself; call 911 immediately. Keep a close eye on the spot they're located in, as well as maintain voice contact with them.



## HOUSEHOLD SAFETY WINTER CHECKLIST


1. Furnace has been inspected and serviced within the past year.
2. Chimneys and vents have been cleaned and inspected within the past year.
3. Any wood for burning is dry, seasoned wood.
4. The fireplace screen is metal or heat-tempered glass; it is secure and in good condition.
5. A covered metal container is ready to use to dispose of cooled ashes and kept 10 ft from the home/any buildings.
6. Children know to stay 3 ft or more away from the fireplace, stove, or space heaters.
7. Portable space heaters have an automatic shut off and are plugged directly into an outlet. They are at least 3ft away from anything that could burn.
8. Test smoke alarms to ensure that they are working.
9. Test carbon monoxide alarms to ensure that they are working.

## SNOW REMOVAL PROCESS

- **PLOWING:** All major thoroughfares are plowed and treated first for emergency service vehicles so they can safely reach residences. Residential streets are secondary. If the major roadways are not passable, emergency services cannot reach any resident.
- **CUL-DE-SACS:** Please be patient. Large snow removal equipment often makes the full clearing of some of these areas impossible because of limited maneuvering ability. Alternate equipment may then be applied when storm conditions have subsided. Remove any portable basketball goals from the roadside, as this makes it very difficult for snowplows to maneuver around.
- **SNOW EMERGENCY:** When a SNOW EMERGENCY is declared, all vehicles on a street must be removed. Vehicles left unattended on a City street during a SNOW EMERGENCY will be removed by any reasonable means, including towing. Such expenses will be charged to the owner or person in control of such vehicle. The media (T.V., radio, as well as social medias) will announce the information when a SNOW EMERGENCY has been declared and when it has been lifted.



- **PARKING:** When snow is predicted, please park your car off the street whenever possible. Streets then can be plowed and treated much more effectively. When cars are parked on the street, it is impossible to plow more than one lane. This also reduces the amount of driveway you may have to shovel!

## SNOW SHOVELING GUIDELINES

- Do not shovel snow into the street.
- It is recommended to NOT shovel your entire driveway before a snow plow reaches your street as snow plows are on fixed angles. The ability to change direction is very limited. The City is not responsible for snow that is plowed from the street and re-deposited in private driveways. Plow operators have very few choices as to where the snow can go.
- Older residents & those with health problems are reminded to avoid the extreme physical activity associated with shoveling snow.
- If there's a fire hydrant outside your home or place of business, please consider maintaining it in the event of snowfall. A clear, 3-foot path on all sides makes hydrants easier to locate and can save precious time in an emergency.

## A smart way to shovel your drive

*How to reduce the possibility of getting a huge pile of snow in your driveway opening when snowplows clear your street:*



## PERSONAL SAFETY

- Stay at least two car lengths behind a snow plow for every 10 mph you are traveling. Never cut in between a caravan of plows clearing a road or pass on the right.
- Beware of "black ice," roads that look wet but actually are glazed with ice. Ramps and bridges freeze first.
- Notify us of any potholes, curb, street, sidewalk or storm drainage problems in the City by using the City's website and visiting the Public Works page or calling the Public Works Department.



### TRASH COLLECTION REMINDERS

**Disposal of refrigerators, freezers and other appliances that contain chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) refrigerants** must have the CFC removed from the appliance by a Certified Technician and have documentation attached to the appliance verifying that the CFC has been safely removed. You must fill out paperwork at [https://www.rumpke.com/docs/default-document-library/freon-refrigerant\\_form.pdf](https://www.rumpke.com/docs/default-document-library/freon-refrigerant_form.pdf) and attach it to the appliance. Once you notify Rumpke of the pick-up, they will pick up the appliance on your normal trash pick up day.

**Cloth couches and chairs, mattresses and box springs** can be placed at the curb with normal trash pickup. These items **MUST** be wrapped in plastic and sealed tight with tape. Please call RUMPKE at 513-851-0122 a day in advance to notify them of a large item pickup.

**Computers, fluorescent bulbs and hazardous waste** cannot be placed at the curb for Rumpke trash collection. The Hamilton County and Butler County Recycling and Solid Waste Districts can help you with disposal of electronic and hazardous waste items for homeowners **ONLY**. Fluorescent bulbs can be taken to hardware stores (Home Depot, Lowes, and Menards) for proper disposal.





## TREES ON PRIVATELY OWNED RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES

The combination of homes in close proximity to one another in a developed community and the abundance of large and mature trees often results in confusion or conflict surrounding the care and responsibility for those trees.

Our department frequently gets questions from concerned residents about trees on privately owned residential properties, particularly trees along or near property lines that overhang property lines and buildings. The City of Sharonville has no enforceable regulations that compel a property owner to trim or remove trees except in cases where the trees were required to be planted as part of an official city approval of a site plan. The city does enforce tree trimming or removal when trees or limbs block public roadways, sidewalks or public rights-of-way. Therefore, all issues involving trees strictly on private property should be resolved by the affected owners.

Property owners have the right to trim branches and limbs that extend past a property line onto their property. However, the law only allows tree trimming and tree cutting up to the property line. You are not allowed to go onto a neighboring property to cut or destroy a tree. If cutting or removing limbs that cross a property line onto your property damage or destroy a tree, you could also potentially be liable to replace or compensate for the tree.



It is best that you consult your neighbor directly about any concerns about trees. Residents are encouraged to resolve tree-related questions or disputes without involving the city. This resolution usually can be accomplished, or at least initiated, by simply making a polite inquiry or request of the other party. If the parties are unable to agree on tree ownership or maintenance, the conflict remains a private civil issue and either party may want to consider consulting an attorney.

Residents interested in undertaking tree maintenance or removal that goes beyond the scope of ordinary yard work are encouraged to contact and get estimates from a qualified tree service. Make sure you ask to see proof of the service's insurance.

## INOPERABLE AND UNLICENSED "JUNK" MOTOR VEHICLES

Inoperable and unlicensed motor vehicles kept on private residential properties can negatively impact the quality of life in local neighborhoods.

Section 302.8 of the City of Sharonville Property Maintenance Code states that "inoperative or unlicensed motor vehicles shall not be parked, kept or stored on any premises, and vehicles shall not at any time be in a state of major disassembly, disrepair, or in the process of being stripped or dismantled. Painting of vehicles is prohibited unless conducted inside an approved spray booth." The Property Maintenance Code defines an inoperable motor vehicle as a vehicle which cannot be driven upon the public streets for reason including but not limited to being unlicensed, wrecked, abandoned, in a state of disrepair, or incapable of being moved under its own power.

Just because an inoperable, unlicensed "junk" motor vehicle is kept in the side or back yard of a residential property does not mean it's exempt – it is still a violation. Please be considerate of neighbors and the negative impact such vehicles can have on the quality of life in local neighborhoods.





## Filing Due Dates for 2024

**Payment of Estimate Taxes:** 2024 estimate tax payments are due by **January 15, 2025** if you expect to owe \$200 or more. Failure to pay by this date may result in a penalty.

**Individual Returns:** On or before **April 15, 2025**.

**Net Profit Business Returns:** On or before **April 15, 2025** or the 15th day of the 4th month following the end of the fiscal year. If a business has a federal extension their due date for municipalities is now eleven months after the business' year end.

**Withholding Reconciliations:** On or before **February 28, 2025**.

### Do I NEED TO FILE A TAX RETURN?

The answer is yes if any of the following apply:

- You are a resident of Sharonville 18 years old or older, regardless of your income level.
- You are a non-resident who works within the City of Sharonville and your income is not fully withheld by an employer.
- You are engaged in a business within the City of Sharonville and have sales, perform services or own rental property, whether or not tax is due.
- Your business is located within or doing business within the City of Sharonville.

### WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING WITH ME OR SEND IN WITH MY SHARONVILLE TAX RETURN?

1. W-2 form(s)
2. Federal 1040 tax return including:
  - Schedule 1, C, E, F and/or 4797
  - Documentation for any income reported on your Federal tax form as "other income"
  - Any other federal schedules or forms which document deductions or additions to your local tax return
3. Copies of other local tax returns or refund requests you've filed

## How Do I Pay My Tax?

- Check or money order payments may be mailed in and should be made payable to “City of Sharonville Tax”.
- Payments by check, money order, cash, or credit card are accepted at the tax office. A fee is charged by the processing company for debit or credit card payments.
- Payments may also be made through ACI Payments either online at [www.CityofSharonville.com](http://www.CityofSharonville.com) or by phone at 1-800-487-4567. ACI Payments charges a nominal fee for this service which may be calculated using the fee calculator available.
- If your balance has been sent to the Ohio Attorney General, all payments must be paid directly to them at P.O. Box 89471, Cleveland OH, 44101. If you have questions, contact them at 1-888-871-8838 or visit their web site at [www.ohioattorneygeneral.gov](http://www.ohioattorneygeneral.gov).

## WHAT INCOME IS TAXABLE?

- Qualifying wages are defined by the IRS tax code section 3121(a). It includes many different types of income, including but not limited to wages, sick pay, vacation pay, commissions, severance pay, settlements, bonuses, fringe benefits, short-term disability pay, stock options and deferred compensation. It is usually found in Box 5 (Medicare wages) on your W-2, however there are some exceptions.
- Other income (generally listed on line 8 of your Federal 1040 Schedule 1) such as gambling winnings, HSA and scholarship distributions, director’s fees, jury duty income and prize winnings.
- The net of all profit and losses from profession and/or business operations.

## WHAT INCOME IS EXEMPT FROM TAX?

- Interest, dividends, some royalties
- Capital gains (unless considered ordinary income)
- Alimony
- Military pay and allowances
- Proceeds from qualified IRS defined retirement plans
- Social Security benefits, welfare benefits, unemployment insurance benefits, workers’ compensation

This information regarding income is not all encompassing. Please contact our office if you have questions regarding the taxability of specific types of income.

## WHY DO I HAVE TO PAY ESTIMATE PAYMENTS?

All federal, state, and local taxes are due during the year that income is earned. Most companies withhold federal and state taxes from your paychecks, but they may not withhold local income taxes, or may withhold less tax than our 1.5% rate. If a taxpayer reasonably expects to owe \$200 or more due to not having at least 1.5% local tax withheld they need to make estimate payments or may be charged penalties.

If you owe less than \$200, but still wish to make estimated payments please note this on your tax return.

Second quarter estimate payments for 2024 are due by June 16, 2025. For your convenience a coupon will be sent with your 2024 tax return. Invoices will be sent for the 3rd and 4th quarter payments which are due on September 15, 2025, and January 15, 2026.

## WHAT FORMS ARE REQUIRED TO ATTACH?

In addition to your Federal 1040 form, we need your W-2(s) and if you file a Schedule 1, we will need a copy of it as well as any included additional schedules (C, E, F and/or 4797). This will clarify the income reported on Schedule 1 and eliminate unnecessary correspondence. Failing to include your completed Federal tax return as well as W-2s can result in a late filing penalty.

## DO I GET CREDIT FOR PAYING OTHER CITIES?

Yes, credit for taxes withheld or paid to another municipality is available to residents. It is limited to 1.5% of the amount of W-2 wages taxed to another municipality, and no amounts exceeding the 1.5% limit will be credited toward additional taxable income. Credits for taxes paid for business income are also limited to 1.5% and are pro-rated based on percentage of total business income. Documentation is required for any credit. There are no credits given for county, mental health, or school taxes paid.



## NET OPERATING LOSSES FOR 2024 TAX RETURNS

Businesses, including individuals filing Schedules C, E, and/or F, may use 100% of any losses carried forward from 2019 through 2023 on their 2024 tax return.

## HOW CAN I GET AN EXTENSION?

If you have received a federal extension to file, you automatically can have an extension with the City of Sharonville until October 15, 2025. A copy of the extension must accompany the filed tax return to avoid penalties. If you do not apply for a federal extension you may request an extension in writing with our office by April 15, 2025. **Please remember that an extension to file does not give you an extension to pay your taxes, so be sure to make all payments by April 15th.**

## PROPERTY TAXES

The collections of property taxes (whether it is for residential property or business property) are the responsibility of Hamilton County or Butler County. **The City of Sharonville does not receive property tax dollars from city residents or businesses and is proud that a municipal property tax has not been levied in over 30 years.** For further information on the collection and payment of property taxes, please contact either the Hamilton County Auditor’s office at (513) 946-4000 or the Butler County Auditor’s office at (513) 887-3154. ## SCHOOL DISTRICT TAX

The City of Sharonville is within the Princeton City School District. The code for state income tax form purposes is 3116.

## Community Center Access Policy

Every person entering the Community Center must stop at the Customer Service Desk to state his/her purpose of coming to the Community Center. If you are a member, please make sure to scan your membership card each time you enter the Community Center and Pool. In order to be as safe as possible and pursuant to City of Sharonville Ordinance Number 2014-13, ALL resident and non-resident guests, ages 18 years and older, purchasing a guest pass will be required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID card. This card will be scanned by the "Safe Point" System against the National Sex Offenders Registry.

The entire membership card data base is scanned through the "Safe Point" system twice a year. New members and renewal members joining the Community Center will be scanned before membership cards are given to the members. Should your driver's license or state ID card match a National or State Sexual Offender Registry record or if you do not provide a valid driver's license or state ID card, you will not be permitted to enter the facility. There is an appeal process.

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on Recreation property without permit from the Recreation Director. This includes but is not limited to parks, shelters, Community Center, pools, and parking lots.



## Stay & Play Zone

The Stay & Play Zone is available for children ages 1-9 while their parent/guardian works out or participates in a program. Nursery service is FREE for children who have a current Combo Membership. The fee for those without a membership is \$3.00 per child per hour. Maximum 2 hours per day. A waitlist will be implemented if we reach our maximum capacity at any time.

## Guest Policy \*Guest Fee is \$5 per Person

Our goal in this policy is to accommodate our members as best as we can, without creating a potentially unsafe or unfair usage of the facility.

- Members age 10 & over may enter the Community Center by themselves. Members under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult, age 18+.
- The fee for a member to bring a guest is \$5.00 per person. Guests ages 2 & under are not subject to a fee.
- Members ages 10 to 17 are permitted to bring no more than 2 guests per day.
- Adult members over the age of 18 are permitted to bring up to 5 guests per day. If the guests are from the same family as the member, they are permitted to bring more than 5.
- Example: An adult member over the age of 18 is bringing their adult daughter, son in law, and five grandchildren from out of town to visit the pool. Since all guests are from the same family as the member, this would be permitted.
- All guests over the age of 18 are required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID to be scanned by our SafePoint system against the National Sex Offenders Registry.
- Members are responsible for the behavior of their guests while they are in our facility. The Recreation Department reserves the right to ban future entry.
- All guests are required to complete the guest sign in sheet when entering the Community Center.
- Guests are required to leave the facility with the member once they have completed their activity.
- **Discounted guest pass bundles can be purchased at the Community Center front desk only. Purchase 5 guest passes in advance for only \$20.00 and 10 in advance for only \$35.00.**

## Refund Policy

Membership and class refunds will only be given in cases of medical circumstances (a doctor's note may be required), if the member moves, or if the class is canceled. Refunds are obtained by filling out proper paperwork at the Customer Service Desk. Checks will be sent to your residence within four weeks. If paid by a credit card, refunds will be credited back to the card that was used for the transaction.




