I'VE NOTICED CAMERAS ON THE SIDE OF THE ROADS THROUGHOUT THE CITY, HOW ARE THESE HELPFUL TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT?

The City of Sharonville has invested in license plate reading cameras from Flock Safety. This innovative technology was selected after much evaluation and allows the Sharonville Police Department to utilize technology to fulfill our commitment to protecting our community.

The Flock camera system aides the police department in its mission to combat crime and assists in other regular police responsibilities such as finding missing persons. There have been several examples where Flock cameras have been used to quickly locate dementia patients here in Sharonville. Thanks to the cameras, police officers were able to initiate a more concise search and get them home safely.

The cameras are a fantastic tool for our officers in fighting crime too. Officers and detectives have used the Flock system to locate and track suspected criminals. One example would be our detectives using the cameras to identify thieves in our community. The cameras provided excellent evidence to support criminal charges against the suspects in court. The cameras are just one of our tools and they comply with our professional values of adopting best practices in service to the community.

The DEA and Sharonville Police Department are committed to our community's safety and health by encouraging the public to remove unneeded medications from their homes as a way of preventing medication misuse and opioid addiction from ever starting.

On the day of this event, a police officer will be stationed on the parking lot of the police department and will receive any unused or unneeded prescription medications. All collected items will be disposed of safely and properly in conjunction with our federal partners at the DEA. Please ensure that no liquids, needles, creams, over the counter medications etc. are brought during this event. Prescription pills only.

DOOR-TO-DOOR VENDORS/SOLICITORS

With the warmer weather coming, we see an increase in door-to-door vendors and solicitors. Vendors are required to register with the City of Sharonville prior to conducting any sales. The applications are processed by the police department and approved by city management. Vendors must also complete and file a business registration tax form with the city tax department.

SHARONVILLE'S HOME IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

The City of Sharonville has partnered with People Working Cooperatively (PWC) to implement the Home Improvement Program for exterior home repairs. PWC has over 49 years of construction experience and provides over 9,000 services every year throughout the Greater Cincinnati area.

General Program Guidelines:

In order to qualify for the City of Sharonville Home Improvement program you must apply directly to PWC. They can actually start your application over the phone.

- Must be a resident homeowner of the City of Sharonville
- Resident homeowner must meet income guidelines (see chart below)
- Owner occupied structure
- Structure must be primary residence
- City funding is limited to \$2,500, unless City allows an exception
- City funding is limited to exterior repairs only (see below)

Examples of Exterior Repair Services

The repairs include but are not limited to exterior walls (repair of holes, breaks, loose or rotting materials and maintained weatherproofing including painting), roofs and roof drainage (gutters and downspouts), roof flashing, roof overhang extensions, walking surfaces of stairways, porches, decks, (all of which provide principle access to the dwelling unit), handrails, ADA ramps, exterior doors, door frames, windows, and window frames.



The City of Sharonville Home Improvement Program is FREE for those who qualify, but funds are limited.

HIGH GRASS AND WEEDS

With spring just around the corner, the City of Sharonville is asking residents and businesses to be conscientious of basic exterior property maintenance and housekeeping regarding high grass and weeds on private properties. The City of Sharonville Codified Ordinances Section 521.13 states grass over eight (8") inches in height is considered to be a nuisance and must be cut.

When the City receives a complaint, an inspection is made to confirm the suspected violation. If a violation is confirmed, a notice of the violation will be sent to the offending property. If the tall grass is not mowed within 7 days of the post date, the City will send a crew from the Public Works Department to the property to cut the grass. Total costs incurred by the City to cut the grass – including time and equipment used – can quickly add up.

The minimum charge for the City to mow an offending property is **\$250**. Depending on the the area to be mowed and the height of the grass, the costs can be much higher. The costs associated with mowing the offending property are **billed directly to the property owner**. If the property owner fails to pay the dues to the City, the City will include the total costs to the Official Tax Duplicate in the form of a lien on the offending property.

Repeat Offenders of the High Grass and Weed Ordinance

The City does not send repeat violation notices to the same property for high grass and weeds during the calendar year. Only one notice will be sent out and subsequent violations of the High Grass and Weed Ordinance will be reported directly to the Public Works Department to be cut.

SPRING & SUMMER SERVICES

BRUSH AND SPECIAL PICK-UP SERVICE

- Curbside Brush and Special Pickup is a FREE year round service to residents.
- Residents must call by Friday **BEFORE 5 PM** to be on a list for pick up the following week.
- Twigs cannot be picked up. They are yard waste and must be disposed of with your regular garbage pick-up.

TRUCK LOAN PROGRAM

- Available mid-April through October for large trash disposal.
- The truck will be brought to your home or business by 3 PM and picked up the next morning by 7:30 AM.
- A release of liability must be signed by the property owner at least 24 hours before the scheduled rental day.
- Cost for homeowners is \$50 a night and \$60 for the weekend; for businesses it is \$90 for nights and weekends.
- Call to schedule a truck starting April 1 at 8:30 AM.



INSTALLING A NEW DRIVEWAY

- You must obtain a permit to install a new driveway from the Community Development Department – cost is \$40.
- There is no fee or permit required to install a driveway apron. It must be inspected at least 24 hours prior to pouring the cement.
- Call Public Works before constructing a driveway or apron for specifications and inspection requirements.

YARD WASTE

Grass, weeds, twigs, and leaves can be disposed of using one of the following methods:

- Composting on your property.
- Placing yard waste and garden waste in bags or cans at the curb with regular trash collection.
- Separate yard & garden waste from your regular trash and take the yard waste to one of the three recycling drop-off locations for residents of Hamilton County (FREE service). For more information call YARDWASTE HOTLINE at 513-946-7755.
- Do NOT blow grass clippings or leaves into the street as these waste materials clog storm drains.

GOLDEN VIEW ACRES

Golden View Acres is a 52-unit Senior Retirement Village located on Greensfelder Lane off Thornview Drive. To be eligible for tenancy, a person must be at least 57 years of age and a current Sharonville resident for at least one year; or be a parent, grandparent, brother or sister of a current Sharonville resident who has resided in the City for one year.



Golden View Acres has both first and second floor units and one and two bedroom apartments. Each apartment has an equipped kitchen with stove and refrigerator, gas heat, hot water, and air conditioning. Tenants pay their own utilities except water. There are coin operated laundry facilities in each of the three buildings. The complex is a "Smoke Free" facility. After signing a lease agreement, THE RENT IS NOT RAISED unless an additional tenant occupies the same apartment or the current tenant moves to another apartment in the complex. At that time, a new rental agreement is then drawn up at the current rate.

To be placed on a WAITING LIST to rent an apartment, a written application must be made and a \$50 fee deposited. This fee is refundable when you rent an apartment or request in writing to be taken off the Waiting List.

2025 STREET REPAIR PROGRAM

Includes curb and sidewalk repairs or replacement and total street re-paving for the following streets: Indian Walk, Indian Creek, Bennington, Indian Springs and Canal.

Filing Due Dates

Individual Returns: On or before **April 15, 2025**

FILING DUE DATES FOR BUSINESSES

Net Profit Business Returns: On or before **April 15, 2025** or the 15th day of the 4th month following the end of the fiscal year.

Withholding Reconciliations: On or before February 28, 2025.

Automatic One Month Extension:

Business entities receiving a 6-month federal extension now receive an automatic additional one-month extension for their municipal income tax returns. This does not apply to individuals who include business income on their individual Federal 1040 tax return.

DO I NEED TO FILE A TAX RETURN?

Yes, if any of the following apply:

- You are a resident of Sharonville 18 years old or older, regardless of your income level or whether you own or rent your residence.
- If you are under 18 you are no longer required to file a municipal tax return, however; you can file with us and receive a refund of any Sharonville tax withheld. Please provide documentation of your age.
- You are a non-resident who works within the City of Sharonville and your income is not fully withheld by an employer.
- You are engaged in a business within the City of Sharonville and have sales, perform services or own rental property, whether or not tax is due.
- Your business is located within or doing business within the City of Sharonville.

WHY DO I HAVE TO INCLUDE MY FEDERAL 1040 FORM?

All cities in the State of Ohio require a copy of your federal 1040 form to be included with your local tax return. This helps us assure we have all the necessary paperwork and are taxing & giving credits for the correct amounts.

WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING WITH ME OR SEND IN WITH MY SHARONVILLE TAX RETURN?

1. **W-2 form(s)** which include amounts in box 1, 3 and 5, as well as all copies including local withholding in boxes 18, 19 and 20.
2. **Federal 1040 tax return** including:
 - Schedule 1, C, E, F and/or 4797 if used
 - Documentation for any income reported on your Federal tax form as "other income" (line 8 on the Federal 1040, page 1), including your W-2G forms for gambling winnings.
 - Any other federal schedules or forms which document deductions or additions to your local tax return
3. Copies of other local tax returns or refund requests you've filed

HOW DO I PAY MY TAX?

Monthly invoices are sent for all tax balances. If you have questions regarding any balance due, please call, we are happy to help.

- Check or money order payments may be mailed in and should be made payable to "City of Sharonville Tax".
- Payments by check, money order, cash, or credit card are accepted at the tax office. A fee is charged by the processing company for debit or credit card payments.
- Payments may also be made through ACI Payments, Inc either online at www.sharonville.org or by phone at 1-800-487-4567. ACI Payments does charge a nominal fee for this service which may be calculated using the fee calculator available.
- If your balance has been sent to the Ohio Attorney General all payments must be paid directly to them at P.O. Box 89471, Cleveland OH, 44101. If you have questions, you can contact them at 1-888-871-8838 or visit their web site at www.ohioattorneygeneral.gov.

HOW CAN I GET AN EXTENSION?

If you have received a federal extension to file, you automatically can have an extension with the City of Sharonville until October 15, 2025. A copy of the extension must accompany the filed tax return to avoid penalties. If you do not apply for a federal extension you may request an extension in writing with our office by April 15, 2025. Please remember that an extension to file does not give you an extension to pay your taxes, so be sure to make all payments by April 15th.

WHAT INCOME IS TAXABLE?

- Qualifying wages are defined by the IRS tax code section 3121(a). It includes many different types of income, including but not limited to wages, sick pay, vacation pay, commissions, severance pay, settlements, bonuses, fringe benefits, short-term disability pay, stock options and deferred compensation. It is usually found in Box 5 (Medicare wages) on your W-2, however there are some exceptions.
- Other income (generally listed on line 8 of your Federal 1040 Schedule 1) such as gambling winnings, HSA and scholarship distributions, director's fees, jury duty income and prize winnings.
- The net of all profit and losses from profession and/or business operations.

WHAT INCOME IS EXEMPT FROM TAX?

- Interest, dividends, some royalties
- Capital gains (unless considered ordinary income)
- Alimony
- Military pay and allowances
- Proceeds from qualified IRS defined retirement plans
- Social Security benefits, welfare benefits, unemployment insurance benefits, workers' compensation

This information regarding income is not all encompassing. Please contact our office if you have questions regarding the taxability of specific types of income.

Walk-ins may be accepted if there are available appointment times.
- We recommend you file early, as the number of people seeking assistance increases dramatically as the tax filing deadline approaches.
- If you have multiple years to file, call to make an appointment.
- For appointments, bring all the required items listed on the previous page.
- Paperwork or check or money order payments may be deposited into the secure drop box to the left of the front door.

WHAT IF I WORKED FROM HOME DURING 2024?

If you worked from home during the tax year 2024, but your employer withheld local income tax to a different location, you can request a refund of local tax withheld by your employer for those days and pay the tax to Sharonville. If you requested a refund from another city your tax credit on line 8 of our IR form will be reduced. Please attach a copy of the refund request with your Sharonville return.

WHY DO I HAVE TO PAY ESTIMATE PAYMENTS?

All federal, state, and local taxes are due during the year that income is earned. Most companies withhold federal and state taxes from your paychecks, but they may not withhold local income taxes, or may withhold less tax than our 1.5% rate. If a taxpayer reasonably expects to owe \$200 or more due to not having at least 1.5% local tax withheld they need to make estimate payments or may be charged penalties.

If you owe less than \$200, but still wish to make estimated payments please note this on your tax return.

Second quarter estimate payments are due by June 16, 2025. For your convenience a coupon was sent with your 2024 tax return. Invoices will be sent for the 3rd and 4th quarter payments which are due on September 15, 2025 and January 15, 2026.

PROPERTY TAXES

The collections of property taxes (whether it is for residential property or business property) are the responsibility of Hamilton County or Butler County. **The City of Sharonville does not receive property tax dollars from city residents or businesses and is proud that a municipal property tax has not been levied in over 30 years.** For further information on the collection and payment of property taxes, please contact either the Hamilton County Auditor's office at (513) 946-4000 or the Butler County Auditor's office at (513) 887-3154. SCHOOL DISTRICT TAX

The City of Sharonville is within the Princeton City School District. The code for state income tax form purposes is 3116.

MOST COMMONLY MADE ERRORS

- Not attaching the required forms – W-2(s), Federal 1040 & Schedule 1:
In addition to your Federal 1040 we need your W-2(s) and if you file a Schedule 1, we will need a copy of it as well as any included additional schedules (C, E, F and/or 4797). This will clarify the income reported on the Schedule 1 and eliminate unnecessary correspondence.
- Net Operating Losses:
Businesses, including individuals filing Schedules C, E, and/or F, may only use 100% of any losses carried forward from 2019 through 2023.
- Too Much Credit for Other Municipalities:
Credit for taxes withheld or paid to another municipality is available to residents. It is limited to 1.5% of the amount of W-2 wages taxed to another municipality, and no amounts exceeding the 1.5% limit will be credited toward additional taxable income. Credits for taxes paid for business income are also limited to 1.5% and are pro-rated based on percentage of total business income. Documentation is required for any credit. We added Worksheet A on the back of your Sharonville income tax return to help you calculate this credit. There are no credits given for county, mental health, or school taxes paid.



CITY INFORMATION

New Energy Aggregation Programs Beginning Soon

The City of Sharonville's current electric and natural gas aggregation programs will expire in the coming months and new programs with new pricing will begin.

Details including new supplier, term and pricing will be available on the City's website beginning March 25, 2025, and program offer letters, one for electric and a separate one for natural gas, will be mailed to eligible homes and small businesses in late March (for electric) and early to mid-April (for natural gas).

As always, participation is voluntary. If you want to join, you do not need to do anything in response to the offer letter you receive; you will automatically flow into the new program. If you do not want to join a program, you must return the Opt-out form included in the offer or call the supplier at the number provided in the letter to decline participation.

Frequently Asked Questions

Why didn't I receive a program offer letter?

Typically, letters are not received because a home or small business is not eligible for the program. To be eligible, you must either be a member of the existing aggregation or purchasing supply directly from Duke Energy. If you are receiving your supply from another independent supplier at the time of mailing, you will not be included in the mailing.

Other criteria affecting eligibility includes: you must live or have your business in the City of Sharonville; you must be a residential account, or if a small business account, use less than 700,000 kWh or 4000 ccf annually; you cannot be in arrears with the utility; and you cannot be participating in "PIPP" Duke's percentage of income payment.

If you think you were erroneously omitted from either mailing, check the City's website and call the new program supplier for information on how to join.

What do I do if I receive an aggregation offer letter but am already under a contract with another independent supplier?

Determine if you would like to stay with the supplier you have chosen or would like to join the aggregation. The important thing to remember is that this process is time-sensitive. If you wish to stay with the supplier you have chosen, you must opt-out of the governmental aggregation. In Ohio, customers have 21 days to respond to a governmental aggregation letter. If you miss the opt-out deadline, you will still have one more opportunity to remove yourself from the aggregation. Once the switch is scheduled to take place, you will receive a notice from Duke Energy that your account is scheduled to be switched over to the aggregation supplier. This notification will give you an additional seven days from the postmark on that notice to contact Duke if the information is not correct, or you wish to opt-out of the aggregation.

As always, the City of Sharonville Aggregation Program letters will clearly display the City's logo on the envelope or through the envelope

window. Please do not simply discard the mailing if you do not want to participate in the program(s).

How do I know if I have entered the new program?

Always check your Duke utility invoice. The first supply of electric in the new program will occur during your May to June meter dates. When you receive your Duke invoice covering this period, check the "Electric Billing" block for the new program supplier logo and price. First supply of natural gas will occur during your June to July meter dates. Again, check for the program supplier logo and price in the "Gas Billing" block details.

Why do we keep starting and stopping energy programs?

In Ohio, governmental aggregation participants must be given an opportunity to Opt-out of an electric aggregation program at least once every three years and a natural gas program every two years. This triggers Opt-out letters and that is when new programs are slated to begin. However, sometimes market conditions dictate shorter contracts if they bring more favorable pricing and that means programs end and begin more often.

Are energy prices anticipated to increase or decrease in the coming years?

Energy prices are on the rise. Overall, we anticipate a 20% increase (supply + delivery) in both electric and natural gas pricing for the 2025-2026 period.

For years, in Southwest Ohio, we have enjoyed relatively reasonable energy prices. The coming years present challenges. Our electric generation (supply) is not growing fast enough to keep up with increased demand. Additionally, our electric grid is under significant stress leading to reliability issues (outages) and dictating imminent necessary infrastructure work and expense. Today, natural gas is a primary source of electric generation, so again the supply vs demand issue looms. Additionally, pipeline infrastructure will require attention if more natural gas is to flow.



Community Center Access Policy

Every person entering the Community Center must stop at the Customer Service Desk to state his/her purpose for coming to the Community Center. If you are a member, please make sure to scan your membership card each time you enter the Community Center and Pool. In order to be as safe as possible and pursuant to City of Sharonville Ordinance Number 2014-13, ALL resident and non-resident guests, ages 18 years and older, purchasing a guest pass will be required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID Card. This card will be scanned against the National Sex Offenders Registry.

New members and renewal members joining the Community Center will be scanned before membership cards are given to the members. Should your driver's license or state ID card match a National or State Sexual Offender Registry record or if you do not provide a valid driver's license or state ID card, you will not be permitted to enter the facility. There is an appeal process.

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on Recreation property without a permit from the Recreation Director. This includes but is not limited to parks, shelters, Community Center, pools and parking lots.



Stay & Play Zone

The Stay & Play Zone is available for children ages 1-6 while their parent/guardian works out or participates in a program. Nursery service is FREE for children who have a current Combo Membership. The fee for those without a membership is \$3.00 per child per hour. Maximum 2 hours per day. We can accommodate 6 children per hour. A waitlist will be implemented if we reach our maximum capacity at any time.

Supervision & Guest Policy

Community Center & Aquatics Facilities

*Guest Fee is \$5 per Person

Our goal in this policy is to accommodate our members as best as we can, without creating a potentially unsafe or unfair usage of the facility.

- Members age 10 & over may enter the Community Center or Pool by themselves. Members under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult member, age 18+.
- The fee for a member to bring a guest is \$5.00 per person. Guests ages 2 & under are not subject to a fee.
- Members ages 10 to 17 are permitted to bring no more than 2 guests per day.
- Adult members over the age of 18 are permitted to bring up to 5 guests per day. If the guests are from the same family as the member, they are permitted to bring more than 5.
- Example: An adult member over the age of 18 is bringing their adult daughter, son in law, and five grandchildren from out of town to visit the pool. Since all guests are from the same family as the member, this would be permitted.
- All guests over the age of 18 are required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID to be scanned by our SafePoint system against the National Sex Offenders Registry.
- Members are responsible for the behavior of their guests while they are in our facility. The Recreation Department reserves the right to ban future entry.
- All guests are required to complete the guest sign in sheet when entering the Community Center.
- Guests are required to leave the facility with the member once they have completed their activity.
- Discounted guest pass bundles can be purchased at the Community Center front desk only. Purchase 5 guest passes in advance for only \$20.00 and 10 in advance for only \$35.00.
