WHAT IMPACT DOES THE SHARONVILLE CONVENTION CENTER AND ITS EXPANSION HAVE ON OUR CITY?

The short answer is: a BIG impact! Since the expansion in 2024, our economic impact is expected to grow from \$15 million to \$27 million annually in the first five years.

The \$24 million expansion was designed to help Sharonville and Hamilton County attract and retain more convention, meeting and tourism business. To do that, the Center needed more room, which it now has thanks to Todd Portune Hall. At 40,000 square feet, the Hall is the largest flexible space in the county during the renovation of the Duke Energy Convention Center.

The expansion also allows the Center to provide more food and beverage options for meeting and event guests. Northern Lights Bar and Grill is a first-in-class free-standing bar and restaurant where guests can relax and take a break from the show floor. Aurora Marketplace, centered on the grab-and-go concept of fresh foods and beverages, allows guests with less time to choose between a wide range of delicious and healthy options.

The increased capacity that came from the expansion has allowed the Center to pursue bigger events that fill multiple dates. This in turn is driving traffic to the Sharonville hotels and attractions. Those events are increasingly regional in nature, with attendees coming from Kentucky, Indiana and Michigan as well as Ohio.

All of this means more revenue for the city and county, more jobs for our residents and stronger economic development.

TUNDRA FIRE EXTINGUISHER/EZ FIRE SPRAY VS FIRE BLANKETS

In the battle between using a fire blanket vs. a tundra fire extinguisher, both help fight fires. FIRST call 9-1-1 to alert the fire department before deploying a fire blanket or extinguisher. Below are some points to consider before using either item in a fire emergency:

TUNDRA FIRE EXTINGUISHER/EZ FIRE SPRAY

CONS:

- Have an expiration date
- Produces a soapy foam
- Fire can relight if not cooled enough
- Require replacement
- Their discharge time is short 8-21 seconds, depending on size
- Not reusable

PROS:

- They can work on a larger surface area
- Very effective when used properly
- They can work on open fires like trash can, pot, fire pit, curtains, ovens
- Able to fight the fire from a few feet away



FIRE BLANKETS

CONS:

- Can't be used safely for large fires
- They're prickly, consist of fiberglass, which is coarse, tiny, sharp fibers that will stick to your clothing or skin
- Require you to get very close to the fire to place them appropriately
- Not effective for a fire that's already spreading
- Require some training or practice
- They're not reusable
- Some data shows they are not safe for oil/fat/grease fires, the blanket has caught fire too in testing
- The fire can still relight after the blanket is removed

PROS:

- No expiration date, usually
- Good for SOME applications in the early fire stages
- Can be used on humans
- Less mess
- Lower damage to appliances
- Less corrosive



FINAL THOUGHTS & RECOMMENDATIONS



- The fire blanket and the Tundra Fire Extinguisher/EZ Fire Spray have their applications, BUT it is the Sharonville Fire Department's recommendation you should have a Traditional Dry Chemical ABC Fire Extinguisher.
- A fire extinguisher is better for extinguishing a developing fire that's hard to access and cover with a blanket.
- If the fire is too large for the extinguisher or the operator is untrained, it's best to evacuate and ensure everyone is safe. Let the fire department work on the fire.
- From our Fire Extinguisher classes: you have one chance to put the fire out, if you think you can. Otherwise, GET OUT, and let the Fire Department handle it.
- Even if you believe the fire is out, call 911 and have the Fire Department dispatched to verify the fire was extinguished. Fire can be hidden in walls, vents, and hoods.

POLICE DEPARTMENT



RIDE-ALONGS

Have you ever wondered what a shift in the life of a Sharonville Police Officer looks like? Maybe you have an interest in a career in law enforcement but would like to see firsthand what a "typical" shift looks like. Your police department offers opportunities for members of our community to go on a ride-along with your police officers and experience, in real time, the various functions of the police department. You will be assigned to an officer, ride along with that officer in their patrol vehicle and respond to calls for service with them to observe. Ride-alongs can be done on any of the shifts. To be considered for a ride-along, that person must be 18 years of age or older, must complete a background check, sign a waiver and be willing to follow a few other rules. Other restrictions do apply. Ride-Along Request Forms can be obtained from the police department. Once completed, the forms will be turned in to our Patrol Commander for review. Participants will then be contacted to schedule the ride-along. Stop by the police department to request a form.

FREQUENT ANIMAL COMPLAINTS

We have seen an uptick in calls for service regarding "dogs at large" and "barking dogs".

Dogs At Large

It is your responsibility to ensure that your dog is physically confined or restrained to your property and under reasonable control. When taking your dog for a walk in a public place or away from the premises of where the dog is normally confined, it is REQUIRED that your dog is secured with a strap or chain (leash) and that strap or chain (leash) must be securely attached to the dog so that the person controlling the dog has immediate and full physical control of the dog, enabling the person to not only restrain the dog but to also be able to pull the dog away from people or other pets. An electronic collar or similar device does not fulfill this requirement.

From time to time, we get calls for dogs running loose. Our goal is to reunite the dog with their owners. If the dogs are "chipped", that makes the process of identifying the owners easier so we can get the dog and owner reunited. If your dog is not chipped, please consider doing so, or at least have a tag on the collar that could help us to determine where the dog lives.

Barking Dogs

We understand that dogs are going to bark. The issue arises when the barking, howling or yelping by the dog is frequent, habitual and becomes unreasonably loud and disturbing and is of such character, intensity and duration that it disturbs the peace, quiet and good order of the neighborhood.

So please, if you own a dog, try to ensure that your dog remains confined or restrained to your property. If you take your dog for a walk, please ensure that the dog is on a leash and can be controlled. If you notice that your dog is barking so much that it might be disturbing others, try to take steps to minimize that behavior. Complaints of this nature may result in a visit from one of our officers and could ultimately result in a citation being issued.

We will only accept prescription pills. Please no over the counter medications, liquids, needles, etc. An officer will be assigned to the front parking lot of the police department to accept the prescription pills and will ensure that they are disposed of properly.

There is also a drop box located in the lobby of the police department that you can also discard your prescription pills anytime.

SEASONAL REMINDERS

FALL:

- There is **NO** leaf pick up program in the City of Sharonville – raking leaves into the street gutters is not permitted.
- Raking leaves into the gutter causes catch basins to back up and flood streets. Rake and bag leaves for pick up and disposal with Rumpke on your trash days. **Rumpke has a 10 item limit.**
- If you have a storm culvert that runs along your property line or under your driveway, it is the homeowner's responsibility to keep these culverts and the inlets clear of leaves and debris. Clogged culverts affect drainage upstream and flooding on roadways and surrounding areas.

WINTER:

- During a snowstorm, do NOT park vehicles on the street. Cars parked on the street create additional obstacles and restrict visibility. Parking your vehicle in your driveway allows for a more complete clearing of your street. Wherever practical, we will attempt to keep the snow build-up to a minimum. We are unable to remove plowed snow from in front of driveways. This is the responsibility of the property owner and/or tenant. Do not shovel snow into the street.
- Older residents and those with health problems are reminded to avoid physical activity associated with shoveling snow.
- Stay at least two car lengths behind a snow plow for every 10 mph you are traveling. Never cut in between a caravan of plows clearing a road.
- Beware of black ice, roads that look wet but actually are glazed with ice. Ramps and bridges freeze first.
- Winter weather brings potholes and other unsafe conditions. Please notify Public Works of any curb, street, sidewalk or storm drainage problems in the City. The Public Works Department will attempt to correct the safety problems in a timely manner.

BRUSH AND SPECIAL PICK-UP SERVICE

- Curbside brush and special pickup is a FREE year-round service (unless it is snowing and we are treating the roads) to residents.
- Residents must call **before 5:00 PM Friday** to have their address put on a list for pick up the following week. Have the materials out for removal on Sunday evening of the requested service week.
- Brush chipping is limited to 15 minutes per stop. If there is additional debris left after 15 minutes, residents must call to get their name on the list for the next week.
- Twigs cannot be picked up. They are yard waste and must be disposed of with your regular trash collection.

TRUCK LOAN PROGRAM

- Available until October 24th for 2025 for large trash disposal.
- Cost for homeowners is \$50 a night and \$60 for the weekend. For businesses, it is \$90 for nights and weekends.
- Call to schedule a truck.

DISPOSAL REMINDERS

- Please keep lids on trash cans at all times. Lids help keep rain water out of the cans making them manageable to handle for trash collection. Please make sure cans have useable handles.
- Refrigerators, freezers and other appliances that contain chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) refrigerants must have the CFC removed from the appliance by a Certified Technician. Attach documentation from the technician to the appliance verifying that the CFC has been removed. Call RUMPKE at **800-828-8171** a day in advance of your normal trash pickup day to notify them of an appliance pick up. There is paperwork on Rumpke's website (rumpke.com) that needs to be taped to the appliance.
- Couches, chairs, mattresses and box springs **MUST** be wrapped in plastic and sealed tight with tape at the curb for normal trash pickup. Call RUMPKE at **800-828-8171** a day in advance to notify them of a large item pickup.



- Computers, televisions, fluorescent bulbs and hazardous waste cannot be placed at the curb for Rumpke trash collection. The Hamilton County and Butler County Recycling and Solid Waste Districts can help you with disposal of electronic and hazardous waste items for homeowners ONLY. Fluorescent bulbs can be taken to hardware stores (Home Depot, Lowes, and Menards) for proper disposal. MAILBOX MAINTENANCE

***Shake Shake Shake,
Shake Shake Shake,
Shake Your Mailbox***

The Sharonville Department of Public Works asks residents who have mailboxes at the road edge to prepare for winter by shaking their mailbox.



The initiative is intended to prevent mailboxes from being damaged by snow pushed off the road by snowplows. When snowplows go by, most times, they don't actually touch the mailboxes. However, the force of snow thrown from the roadway is enough to knock down a loose mailbox. Damage can often be prevented by proper routine maintenance.

Taking time to tighten screws and secure mailboxes to posts early in the year can reduce winter headaches in the future. If the mailbox moves when shaken, it probably won't withstand standard snow-removal operations and should be repaired or replaced before winter.

TRASH & RECYCLING HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

Service will **NOT** occur on Thursday, December 25 and Thursday, January 1. Service will be delayed one day during the rest of the week.



GOLDEN VIEW ACRES

Golden View Acres is a 52-unit Senior Retirement Village located on Greensfelder Lane off Thornview Drive. To be eligible for tenancy, a person must be at least 57 years of age and a current Sharonville resident for at least one year; or be a parent, grandparent, brother or sister of a current Sharonville resident who has resided in the City for one year.



Golden View Acres has both first and second floor units and one and two bedroom apartments. Each apartment has an equipped kitchen with stove and refrigerator, gas heat, hot water, and air conditioning. Tenants pay their own utilities except water. There are coin operated laundry facilities in each of the three buildings. The complex is a "Smoke Free" facility. After signing a lease agreement, **THE RENT IS NOT RAISED** unless an additional tenant occupies the same apartment or the current tenant moves to another apartment in the complex. At that time, a new rental agreement is then drawn up at the current rate.



To be placed on a **WAITING LIST** to rent an apartment, a written application must be made and a \$50 fee deposited. This fee is refundable when you rent an apartment or request in writing to be taken off the Waiting List.

Reminder – All residents of Sharonville 18 years and older are required to file a Sharonville tax return each year.

UNDER 18?

A new law was passed effective on January 1, 2024, which created a municipal tax exemption for anyone under the age of 18. If Sharonville tax was withheld by your employer or you filed a 2024 Sharonville tax return and paid taxes they can be refunded upon request. Documentation of your birth date will be required.

WHAT ARE THE ESTIMATE TAX DUE DATES?

Invoices will be sent this year for the final quarterly payment which is due on or before **January 15, 2026**. Failure to pay at least 90% of your 2025 tax liability by this time may result in a 15% penalty.

WHY DO I HAVE TO PAY ESTIMATE PAYMENTS?

All federal, state, and local taxes are due during the year that income is earned. Most companies withhold federal and state taxes from your paychecks, but they may not withhold local income taxes, or may withhold less tax than our 1.5% rate. If a taxpayer reasonably expects to owe \$200 or more due to not having at least 1.5% local tax withheld, they need to make estimate payments or may be charged penalties. If you owe less than \$200 but still wish to make estimate payments please note this on your tax return.

DID YOU FORGET TO FILE YOUR SHARONVILLE TAX RETURN?

Please file as soon as possible. Mail your return or stop by our office for assistance. Continuing to delay filing will only increase possible penalties.

RECEIVED A LETTER ASKING FOR MORE DOCUMENTS?

If we didn't receive all the required documents (W-2s or federal forms), a request is sent to verify the data on your tax return. Please send the requested information in as soon as possible so your tax return can be completed. Failure to send in these documents can result in lost credits, late filing fees, or additional charges if a payment is subsequently due.

EXPECTING A REFUND?

Refunds are processed in the order received. You should expect a check to arrive within 90 days.

NEW SECURE E-MAIL PORTAL

Keep your tax information safe! You can safely send any documents to our office by using this secure email portal. If this will be your first time entering the secure email portal, you will be required to set up an account with your email and a password.

FILED A FEDERAL EXTENSION?

All 2024 individual local tax returns with a Federal extension are due by **October 15, 2025**. A copy of the extension should accompany the filed tax return to avoid a late filing fee. Extensions only extend the time allowed to file a tax return, they do not extend the payment due dates.

HOW DO I PAY MY TAX?

- Invoices are sent for all tax balances. If you have questions regarding any balance due, please call.
- Check or money order payments may be mailed or placed in the secure drop box by our front door and should be made payable to "City of Sharonville Tax".
- Payments by check, money order, cash, or credit card are accepted at the tax office.
- Payments may also be made through ACI Payments either online (a link is available on our website sharonville.org) or by phone at 1-800-487-4567. *ACI Payments does charge a nominal fee for this service which may be calculated using the fee calculator available.
- If your balance has been sent to the Ohio Attorney General, all payments must be paid directly to them at P.O. Box 89471, Cleveland OH, 44101. If you have questions, contact them at 1-888-871-8838 or visit their web site at www.ohioattorneygeneral.gov.

PROPERTY TAXES

The collections of property taxes (whether it is for residential property or business property) are the responsibility of Hamilton County or Butler County. **The City of Sharonville does not receive property tax dollars from city residents or businesses and is proud that a municipal property tax has not been levied in over 30 years.**

CITY INFORMATION

Energy Aggregation Update

NATURAL GAS



Our natural gas aggregation is supplied by IGS Energy currently at a variable rate. As of July, our pricing per ccf of gas has been “market-based”, and consistently lower than that of Duke Energy:

Jul '25 Duke GCR 63.49 cents; IGS price 48.17 cents

Aug '25 Duke GCR 57.28 cents; IGS price 47.55 cents

Sep '25 Duke GCR 44.85 cents; IGS price 41.0 cents

As we look forward to the coming winter months and beyond, we have now secured fixed pricing at 54.2 cents/ccf beginning at your October 2025 meter read and continuing through the end of the contract in June 2027. As we know, pricing in the winter is extremely weather dependent, and can be volatile. Locking in a favorable price now covering this winter and next as well as the in-between months should produce aggregated savings through the end of the current program.



If you are not currently in the gas aggregation program, but want to join, please contact IGS Energy directly at 1-877-353-0162 and be sure to ask to join the “City of Sharonville, OH” gas aggregation program. As always, it may take up to two billing cycles to enroll your account and you will receive a confirmation letter from Duke Energy that you are switching to IGS supply. If you are under a separate, individual vendor supply contract, contact the vendor prior to joining the aggregation as there could be penalties or fees for leaving. If you are currently a member of the natural gas aggregation, the fixed pricing will automatically apply to you beginning at your October read date.

ELECTRIC



The next Electric Aggregation begins at your meter read in November 2025. Supply will be from Dynegy Energy and priced at 9.39 cents/kWh for the period Nov '25- Oct '26. While no one is happy with the high electric prices of late, unfortunately prices are market driven and the market is reacting to increased demand, due in large part from huge data centers and electric vehicles, and lagging supply, in light of fossil fuel generation shutdowns and an antiquated grid and regulatory red tape that is struggling to bring waiting renewable generated electric on-line.

Program letters will be arriving in homes in mid-late September. As always, this is an Opt-out aggregation; you need only return the form or call the number in the letter by the deadline if you DO NOT want to participate. If you do nothing, your account will enter the aggregation, and Duke Energy will send a confirmation letter to you verifying that you will be switching to Dynegy for supply. Only those Sharonville residents eligible to join the aggregation will receive program letters. If you are under contract with another supplier, you will not be included in the mailing.

TREES, BUSHES OR SHRUBS ON PRIVATELY OWNED RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES

Regarding trimming trees, bushes, and shrubs on privately owned residential properties, particularly in the front yard, there are no enforceable regulations to compel the owner of a residential property to keep up with routine maintenance to achieve a high aesthetic standard like uniformity requirements of living in an HOA governed community. The city does enforce tree trimming or removal when trees or limbs block public roadways, sidewalks or public rights-of-way. All issues involving trees strictly on private property should be resolved by the affected owners.

Property owners have the right to trim branches and limbs that extend past a property line onto their property. However, the law only allows tree trimming and tree cutting up to the property line. You are not allowed to go onto a neighboring property to cut or destroy a tree, unless you have permission to do so from the property owner. If cutting or removing limbs that cross a property line onto your property damages or destroys a tree, you could also potentially be liable to replace or compensate for the tree.

It is encouraged that you consult your neighbor directly about any concerns regarding trees. Residents are encouraged to resolve tree-related questions or disputes without involving the city. This resolution usually can be accomplished, or at least initiated, by simply making a polite inquiry or request of the other party. If the parties are unable to agree on tree ownership or maintenance, the conflict remains a private civil issue and either party may want to consider consulting an attorney.



Residents interested in undertaking tree maintenance or removal that goes beyond the scope of ordinary yard work are encouraged to contact and get estimates from a qualified tree service and make sure you ask to see proof of the service's insurance.

FLOOD INSURANCE - BASIC INFORMATION

Parts of Sharonville, including existing businesses and residential areas, are located within the FEMA Designated 100 Year Floodplain. Homes and businesses in high-risk flood areas, known as Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHA), with mortgages from government-backed lenders are required to have flood insurance.

The US Congress created the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) in 1968 to alleviate the financial burden caused by flooding across the United States. The NFIP is administered nationally by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and enables homeowners, business owners and renters in participating communities to purchase federally-backed flood insurance as protection against flood loss.

Since most homeowners' typical insurance policies do not usually cover flood damage, acquiring and maintaining flood insurance coverage is a practical alternative to help citizens recover from flood losses. The NFIP makes flood insurance available to property owners, renters and businesses in high, moderate, and low flood risk areas. Anyone who has flood insurance coverage that has sustained flood damage can make a claim on their policy regardless of a federal disaster declaration and will be able to recover faster when floodwaters recede.

Sharonville is a participating member of the NFIP so ANYONE residing in a participating community can purchase flood insurance. It is available to all residents, business owners and renters in both high risk and moderate to low-risk areas. Flood insurance can be purchased through a licensed insurance agent or an insurer participating in the NFIP. Flood insurance cannot be purchased directly from the NFIP. If your insurance agent does not sell flood insurance, you can contact the NFIP Referral Call Center at 1-800-427-4661 to request an agent referral.



Community Center Access Policy

Every person entering the Community Center must stop at the Customer Service Desk to state his/her purpose of coming to the Community Center. If you are a member, please make sure to scan your membership card each time you enter the Community Center and Pool. In order to be as safe as possible and pursuant to City of Sharonville Ordinance Number 2014-13, ALL resident and non-resident guests, ages 18 years and older, purchasing a guest pass will be required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID Card. This card will be scanned against the National Sex Offenders Registry.

New members and renewal members joining the Community Center will be scanned before membership cards are given to the members. Should your driver's license or state ID card match a National or State Sexual Offender Registry record or if you do not provide a valid driver's license or state ID card, you will not be permitted to enter the facility. There is an appeal process.

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on Recreation property without permit from the Recreation Director. This includes but is not limited to parks, shelters, Community Center, pools, and parking lots.

Stay & Play Zone

The Stay & Play Zone is available for children ages 1-6 while their parent/guardian works out or participates in a program. Nursery service is FREE for children who have a current Combo Membership. The fee for those without a membership is \$3.00 per child per hour. Maximum 2 hours per day. A waitlist will be implemented if we reach our maximum capacity or staff ratio.

Supervision & Guest Policy

*Guest Fee is \$5 per Person

Our goal in this policy is to accommodate our members as best as we can, without creating a potentially unsafe or unfair usage of the facility.

- Members age 10 & over may enter the Community Center by themselves. Members under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult, age 18+.
- The fee for a member to bring a guest is \$5.00 per person. Guests ages 2 & under are not subject to a fee.
- Members ages 10 to 17 are permitted to bring no more than 2 guests per day.
- Adult members over the age of 18 are permitted to bring up to 5 guests per day. If the guests are from the same family as the member, they are permitted to bring more than 5.
- Example: An adult member over the age of 18 is bringing their adult daughter, son-in-law, and five grandchildren from out of town to visit the pool. Since all guests are from the same family as the member, this would be permitted.
- All guests over the age of 18 are required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID to be scanned by our SafePoint system against the National Sex Offenders Registry.
- Members are responsible for the behavior of their guests while they are in our facility. The Recreation Department reserves the right to ban future entry.
- All guests are required to complete the guest sign in sheet when entering the Community Center.
- Guests are required to leave the facility with the member once they have completed their activity.
- **Discounted guest pass bundles can be purchased at the Community Center front desk only. Purchase 5 guest passes in advance for only \$20.00 and 10 in advance for only \$35.00.**

Refund Policy

Membership and class refunds will only be given in cases of medical circumstances (a doctor's note may be required), if the member moves, or if the class is canceled. Refunds are obtained by filling out proper paperwork at the Customer Service Desk. Checks will be sent to your residence within four weeks. If paid by a credit card, refunds will be credited back to the card that was used for the transaction.

FITNESS & WELLNESS

Fitness Center & Track

Our Fitness Center includes cardio equipment and strength equipment for individuals of all abilities, from beginners up to experienced fitness enthusiasts. The 1/12-mile cushioned indoor walking/running track alternates direction daily and features additional fitness equipment in the far corners. The Fitness Center and Track can be utilized by members 13 years of age and older. Members 13 to 17 years of age are required to complete an orientation prior to using the Fitness Center. Please see a fitness team member to fill out appropriate forms and schedule your orientation appointment. Fitness Center Members ages 18+ need to sign off on a Fitness Waiver.



Personal Training

To help our fitness members get on a road to better health and fitness, our fitness team offers personal training sessions free of charge. Sessions are 30-45 minutes in length and scheduled at the convenience of the member(s) and trainer.

A fitness orientation is an active, hands-on session typically 30 -45 minutes in length providing the basics of how to use the weight machines and cardio equipment. 


