








Standardization





Standardization: First Due Software

- Quick view of call type and CAD notes
- Area Map
 - including fire hydrant locations
- Building specific pre-plan and pre-arrival notes
- Tied to occupancy and fire inspections
 - Inspection history and specific hazards are accessible before arrival







Collaboration: Accountability System

Name Tags

- Name tags are engraved 2½-inch wide by ½-inch plastic strips backed in Velcro®. Name tags shall be issued with the following information: a) rank, first initial, last name; b) badge number; c) firefighting and emergency medical capabilities; d) the department's Hamilton County identification name (i.e., SPDF for Springdale) as illustrated in Figure 1. Officers shall have a white background and firefighters shall have a yellow background.
- Each employee shall be issued no less than four name tags. Each person is issued multiple name tags that shall be stored on the rear underside of their helmet brim.

Passports

- One tag shall be placed on each of the two apparatus or unit Passports to which the member is assigned.
- Passports are engraved 2¾-inch wide by 3¾-inch plastic cards backed in Velcro® that identify a company or unit by its designation. They hold the name tags of the personnel assigned to that company or team during their shift. Passports shall have the apparatus, company, or unit number (e.g., Engine 90, Tower 90), the department's Hamilton County identification name, the amount of water carried on the apparatus, the pump capacity (gpm), and the length of the aerial/ ladder.
- Passport colors shall be as follows as shown in Figure 2:
 - engine companies
 - aerial/ladder companies
 - for advanced life support (medic) and squad units








SFD Community Visibility
